

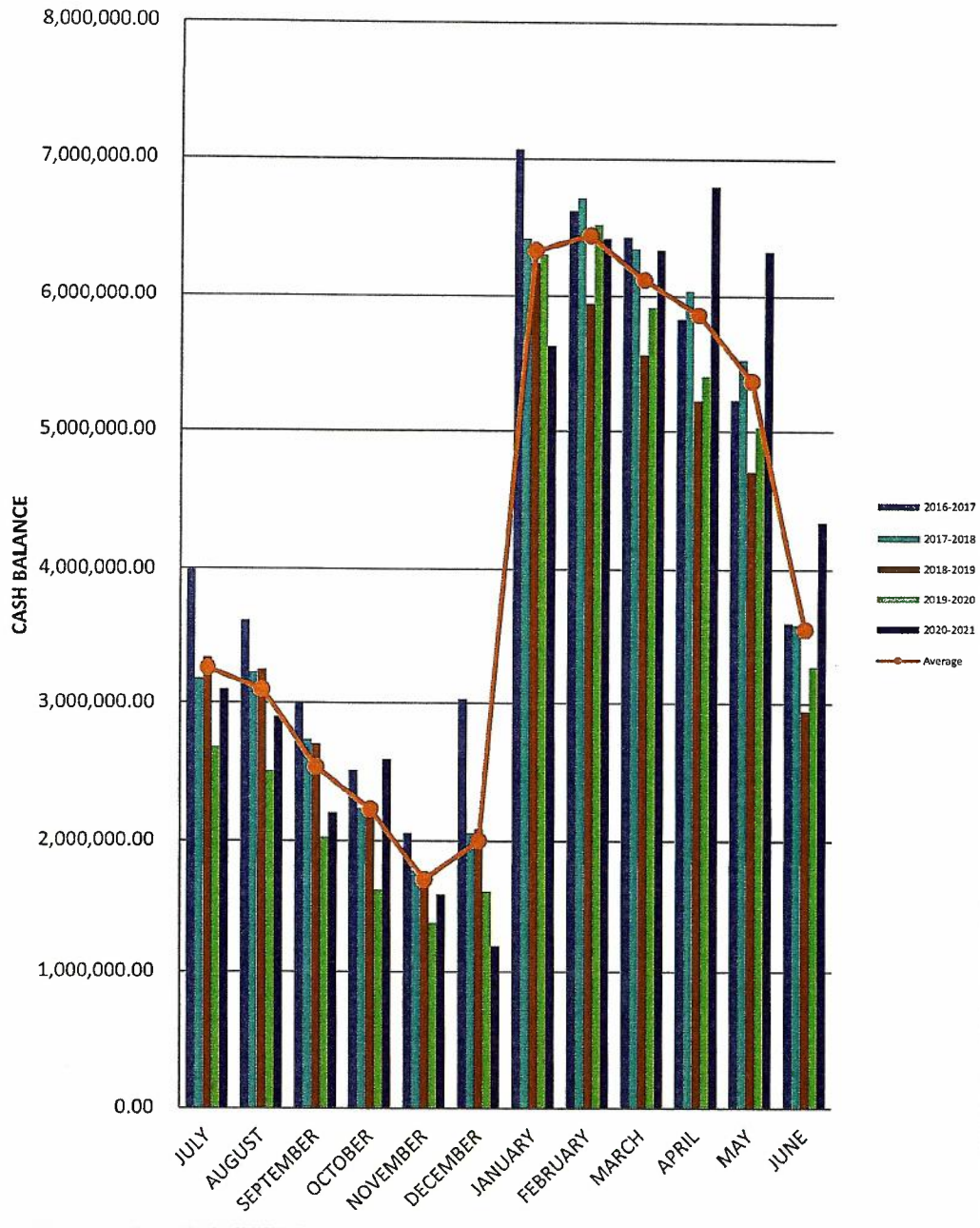

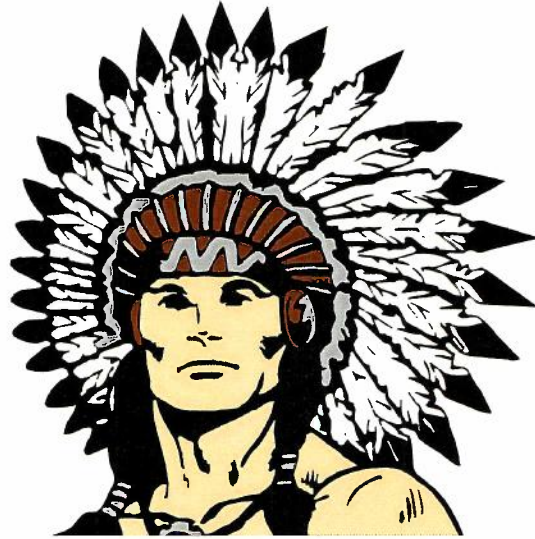

2021-2022 SCHOOL YEAR

The Strafford R-VI School District provided full in-person learning throughout the 2020-21 school year. Families were given the opportunity to select virtual learning for their student(s).

Throughout the 2020-21 school year, the district followed CDC and Greene County Health Department guidelines and updated procedures as guidelines from those entities changed.

This document outlines the plan for the 2021-2022 school year for the Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services (SRCPS), American Rescue Plan Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP ESSER) funds and submitted to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE). Please note this plan will be updated and amended based upon current guidance from local, state, and national entities.

Our district team will be meeting in late July to review all of the health and safety protocols and will use current CDC, Greene County Health Department, and Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services, as well as data from the changes made during in-person summer school to guide us in preparing for August.

Community Responsibilities

- If possible, transport children to school in personal vehicle
- Talk to your child about showing kindness & acceptance to all who might take added precautions

Staff (includes Substitute Teachers) Responsibilities

Continuity of Services

Academics

Virtual Learning

Virtual Learning for Quarantined Students

Students excluded due to positive COVID test or exposure and, who are able, can use Google Classroom to continue school. Students will work directly with their teacher(s) to continue completing assignments from home.

Nutrition

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced that it will extend waivers to continue providing free meals to all children under 18 through the next school year.
