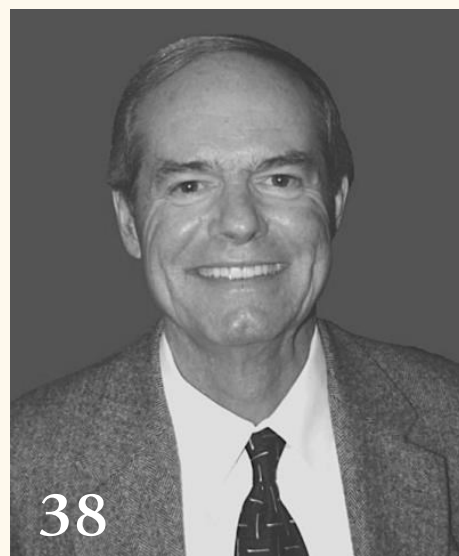

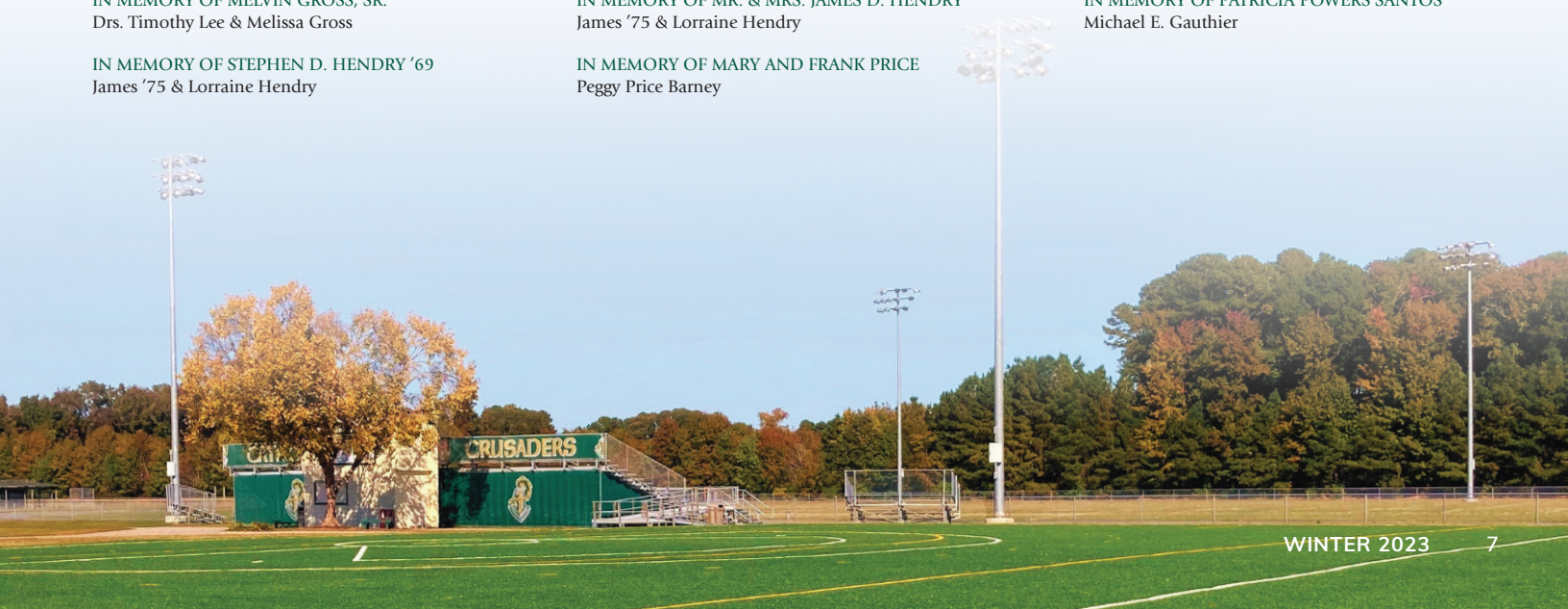

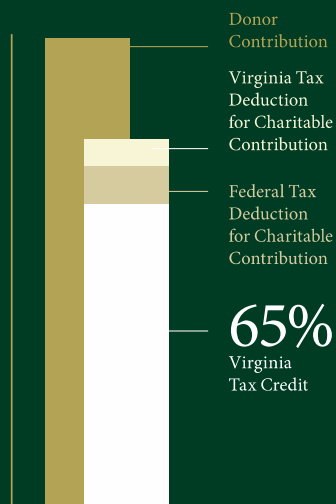

- ✓ Donors who itemize may claim deductions for 35% of the donation on state and federal taxes, in addition to receiving Virginia tax credits.

DONATIONS MUST BE MADE TO APPROVED FOUNDATIONS.

- ✗ Donations made directly to a school do not qualify for tax credits.
- ✗ Donors may not direct their funds to support a specific student.

PROCESS

To take advantage of EISTC, follow these simple steps:

1

Obtain a Letter of Intent from the Advancement Office at Catholic High School.

Also, obtain the Virginia Department of Education Preauthorization Form.

2

Send the completed Letter of Intent and Preauthorization Form to MPSF, who will submit your Preauthorization Form by secure electronic dropbox to the VA DOE for approval of your Tax Credits.

3

Within approximately 7-10 days, the DOE will send you an Approval Letter indicating your tax credits have been reserved for a period of 180 calendar days.

4

Return the Signed Approval Letter with your check or securities transfer information to MPSF within 180 days of the date of the notice. (Preauthorizations become void after 180 days). Make checks payable to the McMahon Parater Scholarship Foundation.

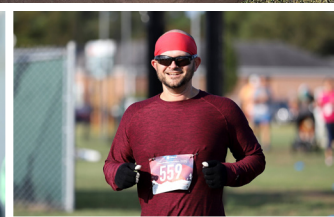
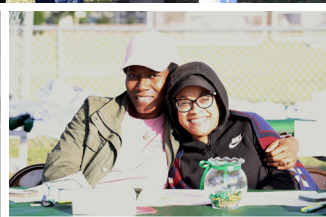

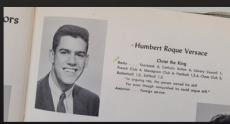
Roque Versace '55 Memorial Meeting

His dream was to eventually become a Catholic priest and missionary and serve the people of South Vietnam. CPT Versace was taken captive on 29 October 1963 when his unit was overrun in the Mekong Delta. North Vietnam radio broadcasts reported that CPT Versace had been executed on 26 September 1965. He was subsequently recognized with the Medal of Honor for his actions as a Prisoner of War. He is the only US Army Medal of Honor recipient from the Vietnam War that remains missing and unaccounted-for.

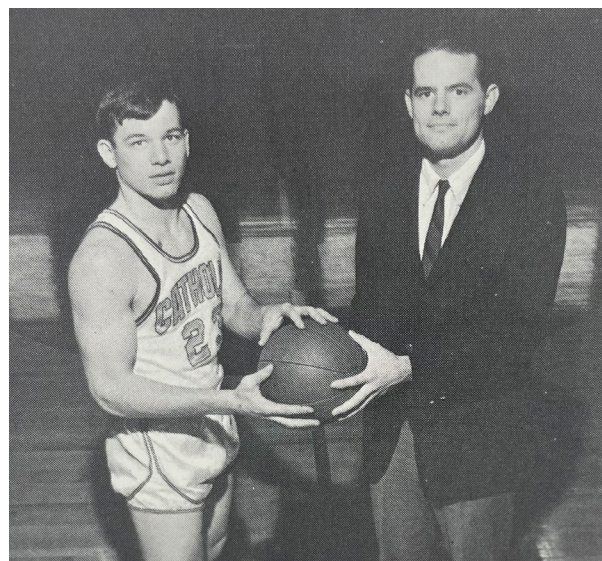
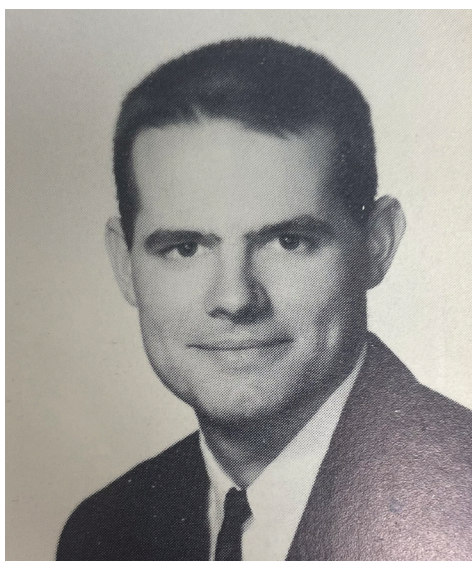
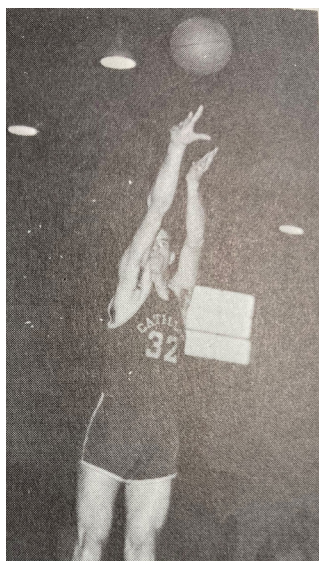


Ed Fraim '59 was a graduate of Norfolk Catholic High School, along with his four siblings, Dick '60, Tommy '61, Kathy '67, and Paul '67. A well-known and loved former Crusader basketball coach, Ed was inducted into the Crusader Athletic Hall of Fame in 1985.

Edward J. "Ed" Fraim '59 passed away on September 1, 2022. Born in Norfolk, Ed was the oldest of five siblings (Dickie, Tommy, Kathy & Paul) raised by his parents, Edward Fraim Sr. and Thelma Lunsford Fraim, on 41st Street in Riverview. Ed attended Sacred Heart School, Norfolk Catholic High School, and Old Dominion University. Following his 1964 graduation from ODU, Ed spent 14 years at Norfolk Catholic High School where he was the Athletic Director and coached men's basketball and track & field, along with teaching history. In his 11 years coaching basketball, Ed became one of the most successful basketball coaches in Hampton Roads and Virginia. Ed was also a proponent of women's sports and by the end of his tenure at Catholic, the high school had seven girls' sport teams. Also known as a mentor and an innovator of high school sports across Hampton Roads, he was inducted into the Hampton Roads African-American Hall of Fame in 2009.

In 1977 Ed began his career with Old Dominion University where he spent 32 years. He became the school's first athletic fundraiser, the first Executive Director of the Intercollegiate Foundation, and ultimately the Senior Director of Athletic Development. Working tirelessly behind the scenes, Ed raised millions of dollars for the athletic department in support of scholarships, facilities, and salaries by meeting personally with donors who, if they weren't already, became his treasured and longtime friends. Ed headed up the ODU Baseball Clinics, raising over \$1M for baseball scholarships. In 2018, The Ed Fraim Fan Deck at ODU's baseball stadium was dedicated. Ed was a 2010 Bud Metheny recipient, and is a member of Norfolk Catholic's and ODU's Halls of Fame. Following Ed's retirement, an athletic scholarship was endowed in his name thanks to his many friends and colleagues.

He energetically and lovingly raised his four children. If he wasn't coaching, fundraising, or cheering on ODU, you could find him at an auditorium, field, or basketball court in Norfolk or elsewhere in Virginia where he was the biggest and best fan of his four kids and his grandchildren. 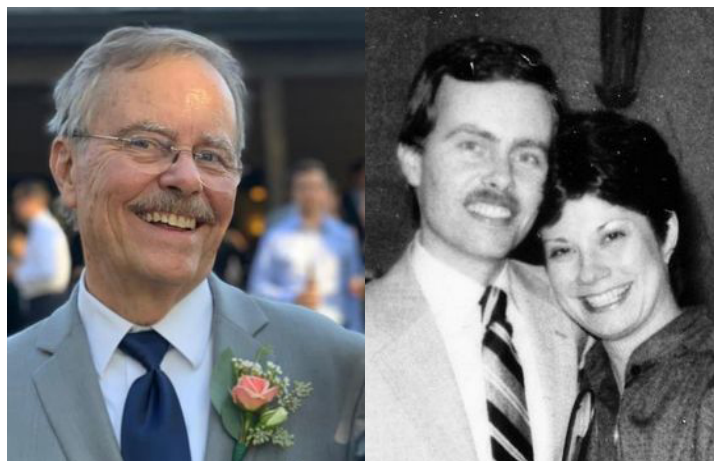

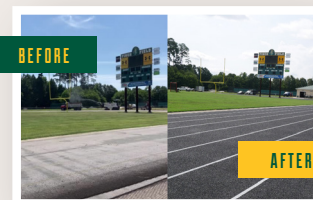


Tangible Support

Excellent Results

The graduates of the CHS Class of 2022 were accepted into 176 colleges and universities, and offered over \$8.9 million in scholarships and grants, including 4 ROTC Scholarships and 5 U.S. Service Academy Appointments.

In the 2021-2022 school year, Crusader Athletics had 6 regular season championship teams, 5 TCIS tournament championship teams, 5 TCIS Coaches of the Year, 5 Players of the Year, and 66 total student-athletes named to All Conference Teams.
