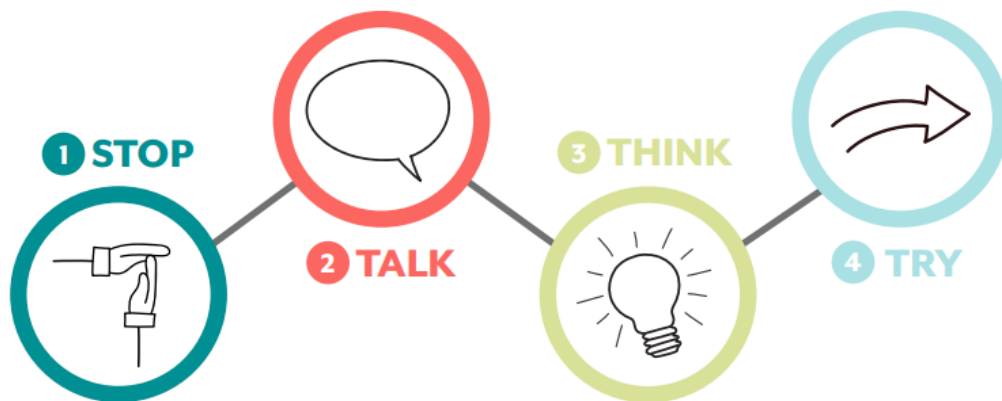

#### **Recognizing and Solving Problems**

Students discussed problems that may arise and the different perspectives everyone has and how we can listen to other’s perspectives when solving problems. Students learned the first steps of conflict resolution: stop, think, and cool off and talk it out. This helps students to understand that their words can affect others. In groups, students practiced finding solutions to problems that would meet everyone’s needs by using the stop, talk, think, try method.
