

- Eunice Frenk, age 90 years, passed away on Sunday, June 2, 2019 at Alden Estates of Shorewood. Born in DeKalb, Illinois on December 19, 1928 and residing in Joliet since 1932. Eunice was a graduate with high honors from Valparaiso University with a degree in Foreign Language. She was a teacher at Joliet Township High School and Joliet Junior College for 30 years before retiring. She was the Foreign Language Department Head for 28 years. Eunice was a life-long member of St. Peter's Lutheran Church. She was a member of the Ladies Aid, the Mission Society, served as a Sunday School Teacher and spear-headed all church activities. Eunice's faith was very important to her and St. Peter's Lutheran Church was her life. Eunice's unique gift was her ability to genuinely engage anyone in conversation and make them feel important. She was an avid reader of newspapers, puzzles and scholarly journals. She enjoyed travel both in the United States and overseas, especially loved her trips to Mexico.
- Anthony Gutierrez passed away peacefully at Presence St. Joseph Medical Center, Monday, September 10, 2019 at the age of 91. Anthony enjoyed 40 years as a teacher, coach and administrator in the Joliet Township High Schools. He was a long-time member of the Industrial Arts faculty both at Joliet Township and Joliet West. He taught Industrial Drawing and also served as a department chairman at JT West. Tony was a graduate of JT and also a successful basketball coach while at JT. He was a member of the Joliet Police and Fire Commission, was awarded with JJC Distinguished Alumni Achievement Award and elected into the Joliet Sports Hall of Fame. One of his his volunteer joys was in taking trips of Central and South America to help with the distribution of eye glasses and eye care. During summers he and his crew, mostly of family members and other faculty built 49 homes in the Joliet area. Tony was a kind, gentle and caring man, a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather and brother. Anthony proudly built over 49 homes in the Joliet area. Tony is survived by his wife of 68 years Dorothy, their children Lisa, Jim and Ed, eight grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren, and his siblings Robert, Jesse, Dr. Daniel Gutierrez, Carmela, Rachel. He loved traveling and being near water.
- John Harr, age 78, of Shorewood, IL and Ft. Myers, FL passed away unexpectedly on Sunday, May 19, 2019. Born November 28, 1940 in Savanna, IL, he was a graduate of Savanna High School, the University of Dubuque, IA, and received his Master's Degree from Northern Illinois University. John is survived by his wife of 56 years, Karen; two children, Steven and Sherry and three grandchildren. John taught at Washington Junior High School and for 30 years at Joliet West High School coaching basketball and track at both schools. He was especially proud

- of his track team winning third place in the State Track Meet in 1987, and the State Championship in 1990. He was Coach of the Year in 1990, and elected into the Illinois Track Coaches Hall of Fame in 2005. His first love was his family and next was his school and the kids he taught and coached. During retirement, he had a great passion for fishing as a hobby and spending the winters in Florida.
- Bonita Johnson, was born November 19, 1946 in Fort Dodge, Iowa. She received her high school education in Iowa. Following graduation, Bonnie attended Northwest Missouri State College, in Marysville, Missouri, earning a Bachelor's Degree in physical education, in 1968. She accepted a position as a physical education teacher in Joliet, where she taught for five years. Bonnie then began working for U.P.S. retiring after thirty years. Bonnie and her husband Jim moved to Emmetsburg, Iowa after their retirement where they made their home. She was a member of Bethany Lutheran Church in Emmetsburg and was also an active supporter of Relay For Life. Bonnie passed away Monday, May 13, 2019 at Lakeside Lutheran Home in Emmetsburg, Iowa, at the age of 72.

David's favorite times were always with his family.
