A permission slip was sent home with students prior to school being dismissed, but you can call the school anytime in June to sign them up for this opportunity for Summer Intervention.

## Nurse's Update

Attention Parents/Guardians of students entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade August 2016

This is to inform you of a mandatory immunization for all 7<sup>th</sup> grade students. One dose of Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Acellular Pertussis) vaccine will be required prior to entry into the 7<sup>th</sup> grade. This dose is intended to be administered as a booster for students who have completed the required doses of the initial series of Dtap/Dt/Td vaccine (prior to starting Kindergarten).

Beginning with the 2016-17 school year, all students entering the 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade are required to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. Please discuss this vaccine with your child's physician for the Ohio Department of Health guidelines.

Please contact your child's physician or the Columbiana County Health Department at 330-424-0272 or East Liverpool City Health Department at 330-385-5123 as soon as possible to schedule an appointment. If your child has already received these immunizations, please send a copy of their immunization record to the school any time, "attention school nurse".

## A Message from the Principal

Graduation is approaching and the date has been set. This years' graduation 2016 will be held in the George Nace Gymnasium at 3:00PM on May 29th. A senior awards program was held on Friday, May 20th in the David Anderson Auditorium. This was a great opportunity for David Anderson Jr. Sr. High School to recognize our class of 2016 students for achievements while attending Lisbon Schools.

The last day of classes for students is scheduled for May 26th as well as the Junior High Awards program being on that same date beginning at 11:45 AM in the Auditorium.

The building will be open this summer for the entire month of June and will close starting July 1st. Both the junior high and high school offices will reopen August 1st. All enrollment questions and paper work should be directed to the Lisbon Board of Education Office located at 317 N. Market Street

Lisbon David Anderson High School summer school and intervention will take place on June 6th – June 17th. Junior High students who are required to attend summer school will report to the Junior High entrance at 8:30am on June 6th for

registration and must attend each session every day. There is no cost for students to attend summer intervention. Students enrolling in summer intervention may be removed from Academic Probation. Students seeking removal from Academic Probation must attend each session every day.

Only junior and senior students who have not passed areas of the Ohio Graduation Test are permitted to take the summer administration of the OGT beginning June 13th – June 24th. Testing for the OGT test will be administered June 13th – 17th.

New student and sixth orientation will be held August 15th at 10:00 a.m. in the David Anderson Jr. Sr. High School Auditorium. Handbooks and schedules will be distributed at the orientation meeting. Parents will have the opportunity to meet the guidance counselor, principals and orient themselves with the building and schedule. Locker assignments will be given the first day of classes.

The first day of classes will begin August 22nd. All students will report to their homeroom before 8:05am during the first week of classes. Homeroom lists will be posted in the hallways and students will be dismissed to their first period classes from homeroom.

#### **Physics Olympics**

Physics Olympics Feb 27, 2016 Youngstown State University 15 schools from the 5 county area. Columbiana County-Lisbon and Beaver Local

Lisbon Team overall score was 1st Place.

Purpose of Competition- To engage students in physics and demonstrate their ability to apply physics knowledge. This involves many areas including factual knowledge and constructing devices based on physics principles. The poster and music competitions allow artistic and musically talented students to show the connections between the arts and physics.

#### Events:

Fermi Quiz- Estimates answers to questions like "How many blades of grass are on a football field?"

Quiz Show- Test of physics knowledge

Flying Machine- Rubber band powered airplane- 2 parts to competition a) longest time in the air and b) distance from a target

Balsa Wood Bridge- Weight of bridge compared to the weight the bridge holds before breaking

Hot water maker- Must heat 300 mL of water at least 5 degrees Celsius in the shortest time possible

House of Cards- Build the tallest free standing structure out of 100 index cards

Mousetrap Racer- Use the spring of a mousetrap to propel a car the greatest distance possible.

Ping Pong Ball Launch- Build a device that uses elastic energy to propel a ping pong ball at a target placed at distances of 2, 4 and 7 meters. Points based on distance from the target center.

Physic Phloater- Construct a boat that uses rubber bands to move along a trough. Fastest boat is the winner.

Hang Up- Physics Poster based this year on the topic "Green Energy"

Music making- Construct three musical instruments from nonstandard materials and play a required song. They must be able to describe the physics behind their instruments. This year the song was "The Lion Sleeps Tonight".

Egg Bouncer- Demo event that did not count for team score. Object was to build a device to give a raw egg the highest bounce when dropped from 12 feet.
