This exciting educational opportunity pairs Southwest Airlines' pilots with classes across the country. They were among 30,000 students nationwide who participated in this program. Our pilot's name is Lenny Diludovico, who has two children that attend David Anderson Jr/Sr. high school. The students completed four lessons with him. They included learning about flight values, time zones, geography, the scientific process, and the forces of flight. They were also able to track the pilot's flights using the airports three letter codes and calculate how many miles each trip took. The fifth graders were eager to learn about his experiences and what it takes to be a pilot. They will culminate the activities with a trip to the Pittsburgh International Airport in May.

Espresso Yourself—Student Run Coffee Cart

McKinley Speech & Language students are working to improve their understanding and use of language while learning to improve the social components of communication (verbal and non-verbal skills which dictate interactions) through their Coffee Cart business named: "Espresso Yourself".

The Coffee Cart business opened on January 19, 2018. Three coffee makers and a cart were donated through a Donors Choose grant earlier in the school year. Additional supplies were purchased or donated by McKinley Staff and the McKinley Elementary PTO. The Coffee Cart gives students the opportunity to work on critical positive social interactions skills. Students take orders through Google Forms online from staff members then make & deliver customized specialty drinks every Friday.

McKinley Speech-Language Pathologist, Kathy Keaggy Brown, said about the project: "Students learn about ordering supplies, organizing materials, filling custom orders, socializing with customers as well as promoting and marketing their business while learning time & money management skills. They also work on receptive language, expressive language, social language, fine motor and academic skills. The students and staff love it!" Keaggy Brown explains that while the project is designed to improve the skills of students who receive Speech Therapy, it will benefit all students as by strengthening the school community through positive social interactions.

A Message from the Principal

All juniors in Ohio are required to take the ACT or SAT at no cost to the student. Our juniors at DAHS took the ACT on Tuesday February 27th. This is the same test that students take throughout the year on designated national test dates and the scores that the students earn will be sent to the college(s) of their choice.

Spring Break this year will be from Friday 3-30-18 through Sunday 4-8-18. Classes will resume on Monday 4-9-18. Any parent who would still like access to Progress Book can call the high school or junior high office and request a password. We believe that this is a tremendous advantage for parents to follow along with your child's progress.

The high school spring musical "The Wizard of Oz" will be presented in the David Anderson High School Auditorium on April 27th and April 28th at 7:30 p.m. and April 29th at 3 p.m.

AIR tests for 6th – 10th grade students will begin in April. Testing for English Language Arts will take place April 17th - 19th. Testing for Math, Science, and Social Studies are scheduled for April 24th – May 3rd. Please have your son or daughter get plenty of rest to increase their probability of success. Testing is another important component of measuring the academic growth of our students

and we would like our kids ready to go for the AIR assessments. The 6th, 7th, and 8th grade Honors/Builders club members will be visiting New York City May 10th, 11th and 12th. In order to attend, a student must qualify with honor roll or merit roll grades for two out of three designated grading periods. Buses will leave the school at 6:30 am May 10th and return home at 9:45 pm May 12th.

Prom 2018 will be held on May 4th at The Vineyards at Pine Lake in Columbiana, Ohio. Prior to the dance will be the annual "Parade of Fashions". The "Parade of Fashions" will take place in the High School Gym. Tickets and event times will be announced at school and posted in the paper. The Dance will follow the fashions event.

Graduation is approaching and the date has been set. This years' graduation 2018 will be held in the George M. Nace Gymnasium at 3:00 PM on May 27th. Nurse's Update

Attention Parents/Guardians of students entering 7th and 12th grade August 2018

All 7th grade students are required to have one dose of Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Acellular Pertussis). This dose is intended to be administered as a booster for students who have completed the required doses of the initial series of Dtap/Dt/Td vaccine (prior to starting Kindergarten).

All students entering the 7th and 12th grade are required to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. Please discuss this vaccine with your child's physician for the Ohio Department of Health guidelines.

Please contact your child's physician, the Columbiana County Health Department at 330-424-0272 or East Liverpool City Health Department at 330-385-5123 as soon as possible to schedule an appointment. Some pharmacies are also offering these vaccines. If your child has already received the required immunizations, please send a copy of their immunization record to the school any time, "attention school nurse".
