As the school year begins and Autumn is almost here, we start to look forward to all of the things this time of year brings. We have a lot of great events and activities planned for the students and families of McKinley for the upcoming year. The **Elementary Night** at the Lisbon Football game on September 6th will allow all students who attend the game to make a tunnel for the football team to run through on the field at the beginning of the game. The PTO will

again be sponsoring a **McKinley Float** at the Johnny Appleseed Parade. Thank you all for helping to make this possible.

As always, we will hold our annual **Grandparents Breakfasts'** during the month of September around Grandparent's Day. The events will begin September 9th and continue with seven straight days of breakfasts, one for each grade level. The cafeteria staff, custodians and secretaries work overtime to help make this event as great as it is. We appreciate grandparents taking the time to visit their grandchildren at our school and the parents who helped coordinate the event.

Our first nine weeks of school will give us time to learn about your students so we can best meet their needs. Students in each grade level complete Reading and Math diagnostic assessments to help us learn the most about your child that we can. Parent / Teacher Conferences will be held on October 3rd. Additionally, we will again be reaching out to families to schedule Home Visits on Friday, October 4th. There is no school for students on this day, and if you are interested in your student's teachers visiting you at home or a local place of business to meet with you, please let us know. We do not have another planned conference evening until February, but that doesn't mean you can't speak with your child's teacher at any time. Home/School Communication is an important part of your child's education and we welcome it.

Make every effort to talk with your child each day about their school day. Spend 20 minutes a night reading to or with them, and spend some time writing and working on math skills. A quick 5 minutes of flash cards a night can greatly improve math fluency.

AM Drop Off and PM Pick Up

I'd like to once again thank the parents in the morning and afternoon with pick-up and drop-off of students. Everyone's patience is greatly appreciated. Some items to remember:

- Please do not drop off students before 8:15 AM each morning... earlier than that and students are unsupervised... too late and they're tardy (Tardy Bell rings at 8:50)
- Please do not drop off students anywhere other than the Cafeteria Doors in the morning between 8:30-8:50...this is where we have supervision during this time. Adults should enter through the main office and sign in if they need to come into the building.
- If your student is eating breakfast at McKinley, drop them off as early as possible to give them time to eat before heading to class
- Please **do not bring pets** to school in the AM/PM, as it sometimes presents dangers/uncomfortable situations with younger students Please leave them at home. Thank you.
- If you're picking up your student(s) from school, please be at the school no later than 3:05-3:10

The school year has begun and we look forward to the changes that a new school year has to offer. One of these changes at DAHS is the focus on Social and Emotional Learning. All Jr. High students have a class at the end of the day entitled DAHS – which stands for **D**eveloping **A** Holistic **S**tudent. The students will experience a variety of concepts and activities throughout the year in this course, including character development and career counseling via Ohio Means Jobs.

In keeping with the Social and Emotional Learning theme, all Juniors traveled to Crestview High School on September 10th to hear a presentation from Stanley Leone Jr., author of *No Place Like Hope*. All Seniors will participate in the Mahoning Valley Skilled Trades Expo at the Canfield Fairgrounds on September 26th in an effort to ensure all students are college and career ready upon graduation.

We continue to enjoy the activities and events that the Fall season offers. Jr. High students who met their state testing goals from the 2018-2019 school year were able to spend the afternoon at the Sadie VanFossen Pool and Park on August 29th. The Seniors participating in fall sports, cheerleading, and marching band traveled to McKinley Elementary on September 6th to read to and eat lunch with the McKinley students. The David Anderson High School Athletic Hall of Fame will present the induction Class of 2019 on September 20th at halftime of the football game against East Palestine with the induction ceremony taking place on Saturday, September 21st in the DAHS cafeteria.
