From the Desk of Superintendent Joseph Siefke

Dear Families and Community Members,

As we proceed through the last quarter of the school year I would like to inform you about a number of important issues affecting the district and our students. The first one involves the constant effort of the Lisbon Exempted Village School District to keep all the students safe and secure. We have implemented some changes involving school safety and the BOE will continue to examine how to effectively protect your child in this ever-changing world we live in. At the top of the list is vaccinations for school employees. My hope is that these vaccines move us closer to "normal "operations by the end of the school year and certainly for the start of the 2021-2022 school year.

Secondly this year's achievement tests that are upon us. There were no district report cards issued for the 2019-2020 school year and none will be issued for the 2020-2021 school year either. The data we will collect from the state assessments will help us drive remediation with in the subject groups and continue to help us close the gap that our children have occurred during the pandemic. All in all, the academic progress in the district continues, and a big thank you goes out to the students, parents, staff and the entire Lisbon community for their hard work and dedication to improvement.

Thirdly, we are dedicated to having traditional school events as we have in the past. It will look different and in some cases not all will be able to participate in person. We understand how important these events are to our families, students and parents and will do our very best to make them as enjoyable as possible.

It has truly been an honor and a privilege for me to serve in the district as superintendent of schools this past year. I would be remiss if I didn't say thanks to all of the stakeholders of the Lisbon School District, from students to staff to parents and community members alike for making this difficult pandemic year a workable one for the students of the

district. I could never have imagined a better place to work and live than Lisbon and for that I am deeply grateful.

Lisbon Exempted Village School District Nurse's Office

Attention Parents/Guardians of students entering 7th and 12th grade August 2021

All 7th grade students are required to have one dose of Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Acellular Pertussis). All students entering the 7th and 12th grade are required to be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. Please contact your child's physician, the Columbiana County Health Department at 330-424-0272 or East Liverpool City Health Department at 330-385-5123 as soon as possible to schedule an appointment. Some pharmacies also offer the vaccines. If your child has already received the required immunizations, please send a copy of their immunization record to the school addressed to the school nurse.

A Message from McKinley Elementary's Principal, Mr. Kemats

As we begin the last three months of the school year, we are continuing to do our part to keep everyone safe and healthy throughout the end of the year. The safety and well-being of your students is our first priority, and educating them in this pandemic isn't far behind. This past year has been difficult for many in the McKinley family, and we are here to help support you and your students in any way that we can. Thank you to our community for all you do for us, and all of your help and support to our schools this year.

For the first time, our district is 1:1 with devices for every student in kindergarten through grade 12. With the recent addition of chromebooks for our entire kindergarten and first grade students, every student in the school has a device to use in their classroom daily. We've worked hard to get to this point and are taking advantage of it each day in school.

March is the time to start thinking about next school year as we kick off Kindergarten and PreSchool registration for the 2021-22 school year. Call the Lisbon Board of Education at 330-424-7714 to schedule an appointment for your preschool or kindergarten student. Preschoolers should be 4 by September 30th (3 yr olds are also considered, with 4 year olds getting preference), and kindergarteners should be 5 by this date. We can't wait to meet our new groups of students.

Our PTO Valentine's Day Room parties were held in February with students being able to make boxes and trade Valentine cards, a tradition we were glad could be carried on. The PTO provided treats, water and a book to each student. The McKinley PTO continues to meet monthly via Zoom meetings. There is always a link on the McKinley Facebook page if you'd like to attend. The PTO will be looking for a Treasurer for next school year, so if you or someone you know may be interested, please join the last few meetings this school year. The PTO is always looking for ideas and input on fundraisers and student events.

We have scheduled in-person events for each grade level this May to take the place of the field trips we will not be taking due to the pandemic guidelines. Preschool, kindergarten and 1st grade will be looking forward to a visit from Outback Ray and his animals. Second grade will be visited by Realm of the Reptile, while 3rd and 4th graders will see The Whiz Bang Science Show.

In past years, our 5th graders were able to put on Veteran's Day programs and take trips to Camp Kon-O-Kwee. While these things have been sidelined by the pandemic, we don't want them to leave without a proper send off. They did participate in the D.A.R.E. program with Officer Stacy of the Lisbon PD. We were also able to hold D.A.R.E. graduation ceremonies in February with a presentation by Deputy Beadnell and K9 Hunter from the Columbiana County Sheriff's Office. The 5th graders will also be presented with The Alans Live magic show, and we will plan to hold a 5th grade end of year recognition / graduation.

Our 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will be taking State of Ohio, English, Math and Science assessments as required by law. Our students will take the English tests on March 23 and 24, the Math tests on April 12 and 13, and 5th grade only Science on April 14 and 15. Please try to make sure your students are in school and on time during these testing days, get a good night's rest, and we'll make sure they have breakfast when they arrive.

We continue to recognize Student of the Month each month, as well as Honor Roll and Perfect attendance. These students were treated to nachos in January, and we'll recognize them at the conclusion of the third nine weeks in March. The third nine weeks ends March 12th, the fourth nine weeks begins March 15th, and Report Cards will be coming home on March 19th. We are looking forward to a great Spring, a great three months of school, and a great end to a rollercoaster school year.





Learning is Cool After School Program

The Learning is Cool After School Program has been working hard on a Pet Project. Students are learning about all aspects of pet care. Some upcoming events we have this spring will be the Girls Basketball Awards Ceremony on March 15th, the Wrestling Awards Ceremony on March 16th, and the Boys Basketball and Cheerleading Awards Ceremony on March 18th. The DAHS chapter of National Honor Society will have its annual induction ceremony on March 17th.

Artsonia



A David Anderson student's artwork wins first place in the Artsonia.com Artist of the Week Contest. Abigail Ammon is a seventh grade student at DAHS. Her artwork was submitted to Artsonia.com by Mrs. Elana Brownfield, Art Teacher at DAHS. Ammon's art received 1,052 votes, securing the first place spot for grades 7-9.

Mrs. Brownfield is one of the thousands of art teachers from over 100 countries around the world who use Artsonia to showcase their student's art, crowdsource lesson plans and help fundraise for their classrooms. Artsonia lets family and friends of student artists create and purchase organic keepsakes from the student art, and then gives back 20 percent of all revenue to the local art classroom.

Artsonia developed Artist of the Week ten years ago as a way to encourage teachers to submit student artwork and engage the school and community to vote on and recognize students for their achievements. Every week, Artsonia selects 12 random submissions in each of four different age groups (PreK-3, 4-6, 7-9, 10-12) from artwork submitted the previous week. Voting is then open to the public for several days before the winner is announced.

Blick Art Materials generously donates a \$100 gift certificate to the winning school and an individual \$50 gift certificate to the student artist.
