We continue to recognize many of our students for a variety of reasons, from Birthdays and Student of the Month, to All A's, Honor Roll, Merit roll and general High Achieving students. We will continue to find ways to recognize students and make the learning environment enjoyable and supportive over the second half of the school year.

As the weather turns colder, please be reminded of the following... In the event of a two-hour delay or closure for inclement weather, you will be notified via our AllCall system, and the closing or delay will also be posted on our Social Media accounts and district webpage as well as local news stations sites. If we have a two-hour delay, there will be no AM preschool, no breakfast and the school day will begin at 10:50 instead of 8:50. Dismissal times remain the same. Please have students dress for the weather (coats, hats, gloves, boots), as we plan on recess as much as the weather and temperatures will permit. Finally, please remind students of good hygiene habits (hand washing and sanitizing often, covering their mouth and nose when sneezing, etc...) to keep the spread of germs to a minimum, and keep students home when they are ill.

The first four months of the 2021-22 school year have shown us what starting to get back to normal feels like and looks like. Here's to a very Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to you and your family. Enjoy your time with family and friends, and let's make 2022 great!



School is Cool After School Program

The Learning is Cool After School Program at McKinley is run through a 21st Century Grant written by the Columbiana County Educational Service Center. 36 students are enrolled in the program this year. The students meet 5 nights a week until 6:00 PM. The program is designed to enrich and support the students.

Throughout the week, students rotate through stations involving reading, math, computers, stem, character education, Spanish, and make a snack. The students also have special guests visit the program as well: OSU Extension, Lepper Library, Yoga instruction, and Whiz Bang Science. This fall the students have visited OH WOW, Forever Safe Farm, Columbiana Christmas Lights Display, and the Salem Fun Factory. The program has also had 3 family engagement nights. 
