We have accomplished so much over the first and second nine week grading periods, and as we begin the 3rd nine weeks, we look forward to all of the great things the new year brings us.

Our wonderful PTO brought us the first annual Winter Wonderland Extravaganza in December. This event, which we plan to continue each year, had students making ornaments, decorating cookies and gingerbread houses, writing cards to residents of area nursing homes and playing various games. The PTO put a lot of time and effort into organizing the event and it paid off as everyone had a great time.

We are looking forward to various events including Music and Art programs for 3rd Grade (February 9th), 1st Grade (March 21st), and Kindergarten (April 4th), Valentine's Day room parties (February 10th), Parent / Teacher Conferences (February 16th) and a host of other gatherings and events. McKinley's after school program, 'Learning is Cool After School,' has continued this school year. Students get a wide range of activities and experiences over the course of the school year.

We have strived to make our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) program really have an impact this school year. Teacher's have been recognizing positive student behaviors throughout the school year, and these students are recognized in front of their peers during lunches. Students have really been excited and engaged in this and we are working on making this program even more successful in the new year.

The McKinley PTO continues to meet monthly, usually on the first Wednesday of each month at McKinley. The PTO will continue to be innovative in trying to continue to fundraise, hold student events and meet the needs of McKinley's students as best they can. Join us for meetings when you can. We continue to recognize many of our students for a variety of reasons, from Birthdays and Student of the Month, to All A's, Honor Roll, Merit roll and general High Achieving students. We will continue to find ways to recognize students



and make the learning environment enjoyable and supportive over the second half of the school year.

As the weather turns colder, please be reminded of the following... In the event of a two-hour delay or closure for inclement weather, you will be notified via our All Call system, and the closing or delay will also be posted on our Social Media accounts and district webpage as well as local news stations sites. If we have a two hour delay, there will be no AM preschool, no breakfast and the school day will begin at 10:50 instead of 8:50. Dismissal times remain the same. Please have students dress for the weather (coats, hats, gloves, boots), as we plan on recess as much as the weather and temperatures will permit. Finally, please remind students of good hygiene habits (hand washing and sanitizing often, covering their mouth and nose when sneezing, etc...) to keep the spread of germs to a minimum, and keep students home when they are ill.

Please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher, the guidance counselor or the principal if you need anything as we work through the second semester of the school year. We want to make the second half of the school year a great one for your students and we want you to be a part of it.

### McKinley After School Program

The Learning is Cool After School Program at McKinley is run through a 21st Century Grant written by the Columbiana County Educational Service Center. 42 students are enrolled in the program this year. The students meet 5 nights a week until 6:00 PM. The program is designed to enrich and support the students. Throughout the week, students rotate through stations involving reading, math, music, stem, art, character education, and Spanish. The students also have special guests programs: OSU Extension, Lepper Library, Yoga instruction, Martial Arts, Outback Ray, Raptor Hallow, and Whiz Bang Science. This fall the students have attended field trips to the Old Stone House and Railroad Station, OH WOW, Forever Safe Farm, Columbiana Christmas Lights Display, Camelot Lanes and the Hot Pots Pottery. The program has also had 2 family engagement nights (Family Game Night & Holiday Happenings Party). A lot more engaging experiences are being planned for the students during the winter and spring. The program will conclude the second week of May. Thank you to the students and their families for their support.
