Decrease the K-4 out of school suspension rate from 6.1% in 2017 to 3.8% (national average) by 2020. (My school's out of school suspension rate from 2017 is <u>(9.1)2017-2018, (4.8) 2018-2019, (3.1) 2019-2020</u>

- The D.C. Reeves will support students by utilizing the PBIS behavioral support program with incentives.
- The PBIS committee will meet to review data and adjust where necessary. Students will be awarded each six weeks for good behavior.
- Students will earn points daily to be redeemed for items from the PBIS store. (PBIS app)
- Students who need additional guidance will be given a Check In/Check Out partner for behavioral support.
