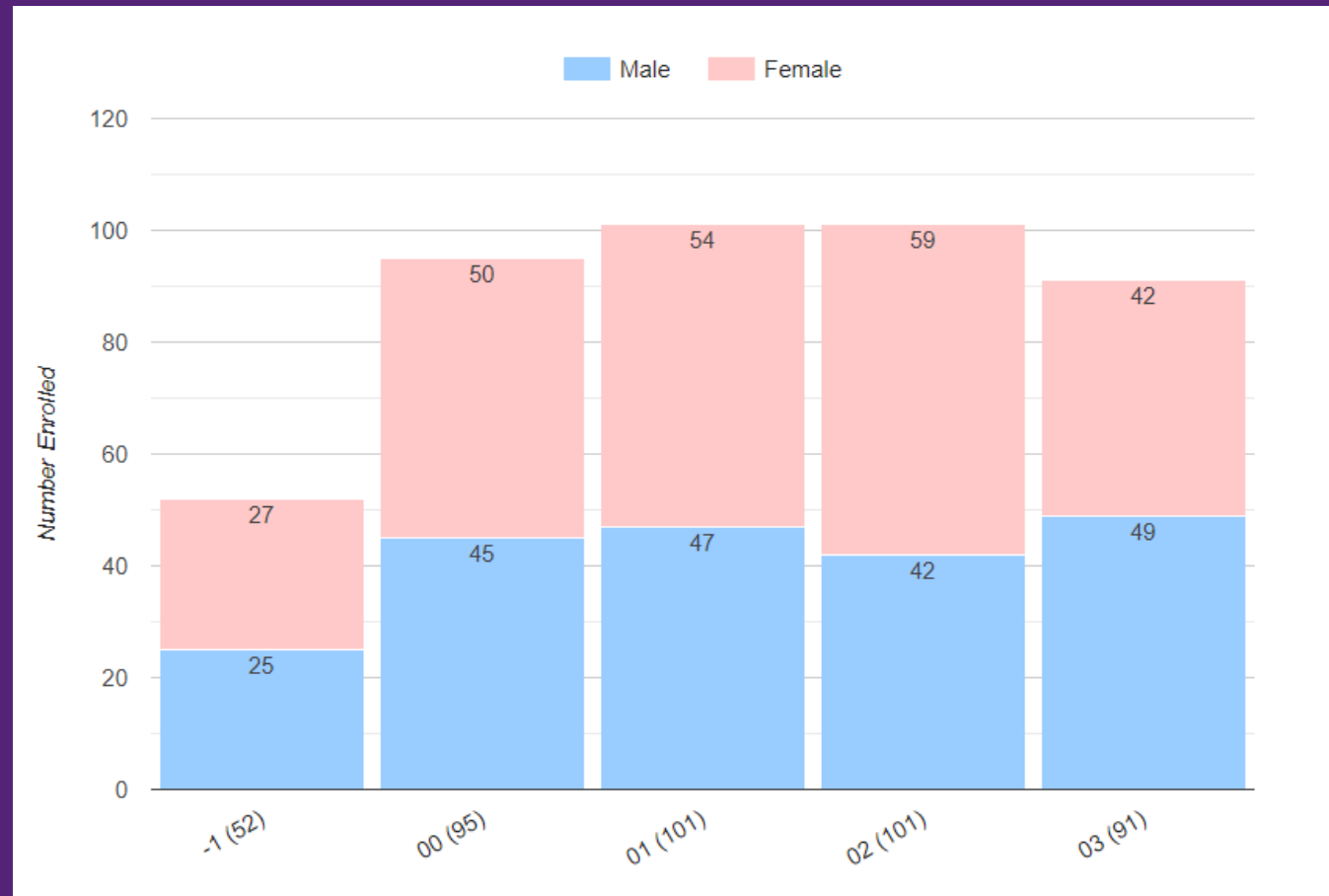
# TITLE 1 PROGRAM

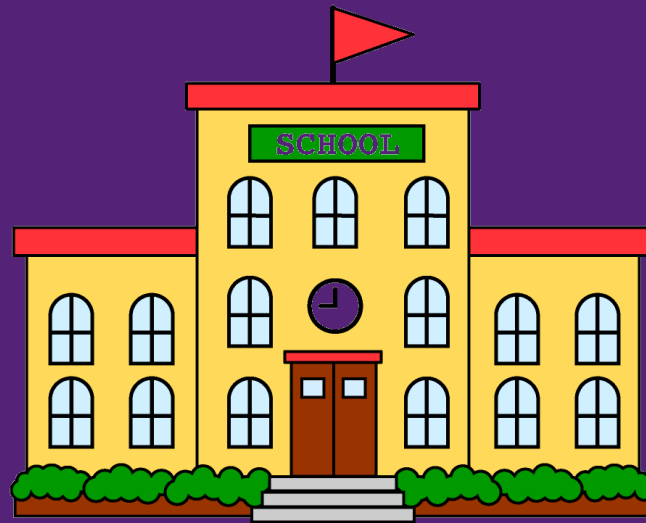

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# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 1

- Woodland Park Magnet School will increase the School Performance Score from \_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_ in 2022-2023.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 2 & 3

- At Woodland Park Magnet School 78% of Kindergarten students will score proficient or above on the EOY district ELA district checkpoint.
- At Woodland Park Magnet School 49% of Kindergarten students will score proficient or above on the EOY district Math district checkpoint.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 4 & 5

- At Woodland Park Magnet School 44% of first grade students will score proficient or above on the EOY district ELA district checkpoint.
- At Woodland Park Magnet School 52% of first grade students will score proficient or above on the EOY district Math district checkpoint.



# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 6 & 7

- At Woodland Park Magnet School 55% of second grade students will score proficient or above on the EOY district ELA district checkpoint.
- At Woodland Park Magnet School 64% of second grade students will score proficient or above on the EOY district Math district checkpoint.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 8 & 9

- At Woodland Park Magnet School third grade students will increase the percentage who achieve mastery on their LEAP 2025 assessment in ELA from 5% to 8%.
- At Woodland Park Magnet School third grade students will increase the percentage who achieve mastery on their LEAP 2025 assessment in Math from 6% to 9%.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 10

- At Woodland Park Magnet School the number of students receiving zero out of school suspension during the 2022-2023 school year will be maintained between 95% to 100% of students.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 11

- Woodland Park Magnet School will improve Cultural Awareness and Action from a positive 62% to 72% positive response as evidenced in Panorama school survey.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 12

- During the 2022-2023 school year, 25% of parents and families will attend Parental and Family engagement opportunities during the school year.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 13

- During the 2022-2023 school year, the percentage of students not truant from Woodland Park Magnet School will increase from 64% to 69% based on the Truancy Summary Count Report.

# SCHOOL WIDE GOAL 14

- Woodland Park Magnet School will improve school climate from positive 55% response rate to 60% positive response as evidence in Panorama school survey.

# SUPPORT YOUR CHILDREN

- Have a schedule and routine for your children to complete activities.
- Ensure your children attend school each day unless there is an illness or other circumstances that warrant them not attending.
- Encourage your children to do their personal best every day and attempt every task even if it is difficult.
- Have frequent discussion with your children about the appropriate way to use social media and warn them of the consequences that misusing it can bring.
- To boost inquiry, ask your child questions and encourage him/her to ask questions about the world.
