



New: Eligibility for Limited Group of Homeschooled and Virtual Students School Year 2022-2023

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced that a new limited group of homeschooled and virtual students may be eligible to receive Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) benefits for the school year 2022-2023. To receive P-EBT benefits, homeschool and virtual school students must meet specific eligibility requirements:

1. Attended a school participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) at some point before the start of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, or the child enrolled in kindergarten as a virtual or homeschooled student in the school year 2020-2021 or later.

AND

2. Currently not attending an NSLP-participating school *due to concerns about COVID-19*.

AND

3. Would have been eligible for free or reduced-price meals* at their NSLP school if not for their virtual or homeschool status.

How can your school help this newly eligible group receive P-EBT benefits?

- Schools must share information with potentially eligible families in these newly identified eligible populations through various communication platforms, including but not limited to, school website, social media, and direct outreach.
- Schools will need to review, approve or decline Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students that families are required to complete to qualify for P-EBT benefits.
- Schools will need communicate with families if a student is determined not eligible to receive P-EBT benefits.
- Schools must create State Student IDs for those home-schooled or virtual learning students who do not have one.
- Schools and districts will be responsible for entering a child's information into the P-EBT Portal upon approval of their FRP status.

* An Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students will need to be submitted along with supporting income documentation to verify income eligibility.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your children may be eligible to receive a pre-loaded Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card that can be used to purchase groceries. Your children may be eligible for Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) benefits if:

1. Your child previously attended a school participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) at some point after the start of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, or the child enrolled in kindergarten as a virtual or homeschooled student in school year 2020-2021 or later, **and**
2. Your child is not attending a National School Lunch Program (NSLP)-participating school *due to concerns about COVID-19*, **and**
3. Your child would have been eligible for free or reduced-price meals at their NSLP school if not for their virtual or homeschool status.

To learn if your children qualify for P-EBT benefits, complete the enclosed Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students. Note: Applying for this P-EBT benefits does not make your child eligible to receive free meals at school if they are currently enrolled as a virtual or homeschooled student.

Commonly Asked Questions:

1. **What is P-EBT?** Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) is a temporary federal program that provides food benefits to Minnesota families with children who would have received free or reduced-price meals if schools were open. 2. **Can my child get P-EBT if my family receives other assistance programs?** Children in households participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), and foster, homeless, migrant and runaway children can get P-EBT benefits without reporting household income. Alternatively, children can get P-EBT benefits if their household income is within the maximum income shown for their household size on the instructions.
3. **Are homeschooled or fully virtual students eligible for P-EBT benefits if they are approved for free or reduced school meals?** Not necessarily. Homeschooled or fully virtual students qualify for P-EBT if all criteria below are met:
 - a. Child previously attended a school participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) at some point after the start of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, or the child enrolled in kindergarten as a virtual or homeschooled student in school year 2020-2021 or later, **and**
 - b. Child is not attending an NSLP-participating school *due to concerns about COVID-19*, **and**
 - c. Child would have been eligible for free or reduced-price meals at their NSLP school if not for the their virtual or homeschool status.
4. **I get Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) or Medical Assistance. Can my children get P-EBT benefits?** Children in households participating in WIC or Medical Assistance do not automatically qualify for P-EBT benefits. Children may be eligible for P-EBT benefits depending on other household financial information. Please fill out an application and return it with appropriate financial documentation.
5. **Who should I include as household members?** Include yourself and all other people living in the household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives or friends).
6. **May I apply if someone in my household is not a U.S. citizen?** Yes. You or your children do not have to be U.S. citizens for your children to qualify for P-EBT benefits.

7. **What if my income is not always the same?** List the amount that you normally get. If you normally get overtime, include it, but not if you get overtime only sometimes. For seasonal work, write in the total annual income.
8. **Will the income information or case number I give be checked?** It may be. We also ask you to send written documentation.
9. **How will the information be kept?** Information you provide on the form, and your child's approval for P-EBT benefits, will be protected as private data. For more information, see the back page of the Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students.
10. **If I don't qualify now, may I apply later?** Yes. Please complete an application at any time if your income goes down, your household size goes up, or you start getting SNAP, MFIP or FDPIR benefits.

Please submit your child's application and return it, with appropriate financial documentation, to the school your child either attended in the past or the school they would be enrolled in if you had no COVID-19 concerns.

The information requested about children's racial identity and ethnicity is requested to assure us the application reached all community members. This information is not required for approval of P-EBT benefits.

How to Apply for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students

Complete the Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students form for school year 2022-23 if any of the following applies to your household:

- Any household member currently participates in the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP), or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), or the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) or
- The household includes one or more foster children (a welfare agency or court has legal responsibility for the child) or
- The total income of household members is within the guidelines shown below (**gross earnings before deductions**, not take-home pay). Do not include as income: foster care payments, federal education benefits, MFIP payments, or value of assistance received from SNAP, WIC, or FDPIR. Military: Do not include combat pay or assistance from the Military Privatized Housing Initiative. The income guidelines are effective from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.

- Step 1: Children.** List all infants and children in the household, their school and grade if applicable, and birthdate. Attach an additional page if needed to list all children. Check the box if a child is in foster care (a welfare agency or court has legal responsibility for the child).
- Step 2: Case Number.** If any household member currently participates in SNAP, MFIP or FDPIR, write in the case number and then go to Step 4. If you do not participate in any of these programs, leave Step 2 blank and continue on to Step 3.
- Step 3: Adult and Child Incomes/Last 4 Digits of Social Security Number**
 - Social Security Number/Total Household Members. An adult household member must provide the last four digits of their Social Security number or check the box if they do not have a Social Security number. Report the total number of household members and ensure all household members are listed individually on the application in the child or adult section as applicable.
 - Child Income. If any children in the household have regular income, such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or part-time jobs, list the total amount of regular incomes received by all children and check the box for the frequency: weekly, bi-weekly, twice a month or monthly. Do not include occasional earnings like babysitting or lawn mowing.
 - Adult income. Report the names of adult household members and income earned in this section.
 - List all adults living in the household not listed in Step 1, whether related or not, such as grandparents, relatives, or friends.
 - Gross Earnings from Work. This is usually the money received from working at jobs where a paycheck is received. For each income, check the box to show how often the income is received: weekly, bi-weekly, twice per month, or monthly.

- List gross incomes before deductions, not take-home pay. Do not list an hourly wage rate. For adults with no income to report, enter a '0' or leave the section blank. For seasonal work, write in the total annual income.
- Are you Self-Employed or a Farmer? List the net income per month or year after business expenses. Do not list the same income twice on the application. A loss from farm or self-employment must be listed as 0 income and does not reduce other income.
- Any Other Gross Income. List gross incomes before deductions from all other sources, such as SSI, unemployment, child support, public assistance, social security, rental income or annuities.

4. **Step 4: Signature and Contact Information.** An adult household member must sign the form. If you do not want your information to be shared with Minnesota Health Care Programs, check the "Don't share" box in Step 4.

Optional: Please provide the information on ethnicity and race that is requested on the second page of the form. This information is not required and does not affect approval for P-EBT benefits. The information helps to ensure we are meeting civil rights requirements and fully serving our community.

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The **Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act** requires the information on this application. You do not have to give the information, but if you do not, we cannot approve your child for P-EBT benefits. You must include the last four digits of the social security number of the adult household member who signs the application. The last four digits of the social security number is not required when you apply on behalf of a foster child or you list a Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Program or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) case number or other FDPIR identifier for your child or when you indicate that the adult household member signing the application does not have a social security number. We will use your information to determine if your child is eligible for P-EBT benefits. We may share your eligibility information with education, health, and nutrition programs to help them evaluate, fund, or determine benefits for their programs, auditors for program reviews and law enforcement officials to help them look into violations of program rules.

At public school districts, each student's P-EBT eligibility status is also recorded on a statewide computer system used to report student data to Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) as required by state law. MDE uses this information to: (1) Administer state and federal programs, (2) Calculate compensatory revenue for public schools and (3) Judge the quality of the state's educational program.

What do families need to do to be eligible to receive P-EBT benefits?

Families will need to reach out to the school their child either attended in the past or the school they would have enrolled in if not for concerns related to COVID-19 and complete an Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students to learn if they qualify for P-EBT benefits.

The Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students requires families to provide specific documents that verify information including household size, children or dependents, and income level. Parents or legal guardians must attest the reason their child enrolled in homeschool or virtual school was due to concerns about COVID-19.

Once families complete the Application for P-EBT Benefits for Homeschool and Virtual Students, schools will review the application and determine if a student is eligible to receive P-EBT benefits. The school will reach out to the families notifying them whether a student is eligible to receive P-EBT benefits. Benefits for eligible students will be issued on a case-by-case basis based on applications received.

Please note that applying for this P-EBT benefits does not make a child eligible to receive free meals at school if they are currently enrolled as a virtual or homeschooled student.
