(Qualifications: You must be a United States citizen, 18 years of age or older and a district resident for at least 30 days prior to the date of the vote)

VOTER INFORMATION

QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS

In order to vote, you must:

- Be a United States citizen
- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a district resident for at least 30 days prior to the vote date
- Eligible voters include those who have voted in federal, state, county, or school district elections within the past four years, those who have registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections, and residents who registered during the school district's registration period
- Must register no later than May 3, 2016 in order to be eligible to vote at our May 17, 2016 Budget and Trustee election

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

If a voter wishes to vote with an Absentee Ballot, he/she must complete an application for an Absentee Ballot and submit the application to the District Clerk, who will then provide the Absentee Ballot. The application must be received at least seven (7) days (May 10th) before the election if the Absentee Ballot is to be mailed to the voter. Persons designated by the Nassau County Board of Elections as "permanently disabled" pursuant to the provision of the Election Law, will automatically receive an absentee ballot. The District Clerk's Office is located in Thayer House on the Glen Cove High School campus, Dosoris Lane. For more information, please call the District Clerk at 801-7037. Absentee Ballots must be filed with the District Clerk no later than 5:00pm election day (May 17, 2016), anything after 5:00pm will not be valid.

Absentee Ballot Information

Who is eligible to cast an absentee ballot rather than have to vote in person?

An absentee ballot can be used by anyone who is unable to appear in person on the day of the School District election for any of the following reasons:

- An individual that is a patient in a hospital, or is unable to appear personally at the polling place due to illness or physical disability
- An individual that is required to be outside of the county on the day of the vote because of special duties, occupation, business, or studies
- An individual that is on vacation elsewhere on such day
- An individual that is detained in jail awaiting action by a grand jury, awaiting trial or confined to prison after a conviction for an offense other than a felony

What other requirements must be met and procedures followed before an individual can cast an absentee ballot?

Requirements:

- An individual must be a United States citizen
- An individual must be a registered voter in the district
- An individual must be 18 years of age
- An individual must reside in the district for 30 days before the election

Procedures:

- An individual who wants to cast an absentee ballot must complete, sign and return the Absentee Ballot Application form to the District Clerk – at Glen Cove City School District, 154 Dosoris Lane, Glen Cove, NY 11542 by May 10, 2016 or the day before the election if the ballot is to be personally delivered to the voter.
- Absentee ballots can only be delivered to the individual who has applied for the absentee ballot
- All signed and completed absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 17, 2016 to the District Clerk's office at Thayer house and not any polling place to be valid
- Residents who are registered with the Nassau County Board of Elections as "Permanently Disabled" will be sent their ballots automatically and need not apply

VOTER INFORMATION

QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS

In order to vote, you must:
