

Our AP courses are open to all students, regardless of previous courses taken


All students are encouraged to take at least one AP course before graduation



PSAT data is used to identify students with "AP Potential"

AP Potential letters are sent to students and parents

Other data points used to identify students who could be successful:

- PARCC scores
- Renaissance STAR Reading and Math
- Course grades
- Teacher recommendations

Culture - Teacher Buy-In



All teachers, including AP teachers, must buy-in to the open enrollment policy

Teachers must be willing to work with all students, regardless of their academic background

Teachers work with students before and after school and during lunch to support them and ensure their success

Teachers give practice AP exams in the evenings and on weekends to simulate the exam experience for students

Teachers are recognized at the first faculty meeting of the year with plaques and trophies for AP student achievements

Culture - Student Buy-In



Students are encouraged to take AP courses when they meet with guidance counselors for scheduling

Any students who want to drop an AP course must meet with the principal
