Guidelines Checklist:

- I live and / or go to school in Washington County.
 - Poems are previously unpublished and my own work.
 - The title of the poem is included at the top of the page.
 - My name does **not** appear on the poem I am submitting.

- There are two contest categories: Middle School (grades 6-8) and High School (grades 9-12).
 - Entries are judged on originality, voice, and overall impression.
 - Subject matter of the entries should be in good taste and appropriate for a broad audience.
 - The decision of the judges is final.
 - Poems with plagiarized content will be disqualified from the contest. Plagiarizing content is copying words, phrases, or ideas from any outside source (ex: Internet). All words and ideas must be your own, nothing quoted or cited.
