

Librarian of the Year 'A True Powerhouse'

Mary McCarthy of Bobbie Smith Elementary School has earned the Teacher Librarian of the Year Award from the Long Beach School Librarians

Association. She was recognized at a recent Board of Education meeting, where Association President Nina Jackson commended her for 21 years of exemplary service.

"Mary is a true powerhouse," Jackson said. 'She has truly made the library the heart of Smith Elementary.

McCarthy has created

several library programs that bring together students, parents, staff, community organizations and businesses. She built support for a renovation of the library that now includes iPads, an eBook library, a SMART Board and other technology.

'It has been the ultimate joy for me to be at Smith," McCarthy said, "and I want to thank my colleagues, my Long Beach School Librarians Association board members. I know how hard you work, how dedicated you are. The library is such a place of love and light. It changed my life as a little kid. I want to make sure that love and light and treasure is there for our kids in the future.

McCarthy's school was named after former librarian and retired Long Beach Unified School District Board of Education President Bobbie Smith in 2014.

'You can't imagine my glee that we're called Bobbie Smith after a librarian, and that has made me so happy," McCarthy said, "and I tell that story to the children on and on.

Open Enrollment in May for Benefits, FSA

From May 1 to 31, employees can enroll in or make changes to medical, dental, vision and Flexible Spending Account plans for the 2018-19 plan year. The new plan year starts July 1 and ends June 30, 2019.

For employees who do not make changes, current elections will continue for the 2018-19 plan year with the exception of the FSA plans. By IRS rule, current FSA enrollment does not carry over to the next year. Employees on the Blue Shield medical plans who don't make any changes will continue on the equivalent Aetna medical plan.

Board OKs Raises for Teachers, Non-Reps

The Long Beach Unified School District Board of Education approved salary increases for Teachers Association of Long Beach members and non-represented employees last week. The board also is likely to consider compensation for California School Employees Association members at its next regular meeting on May 2.

TALB members and non-represented employees, including managers, will receive an ongoing salary increase of 1 percent, plus a one-time increase of 1 percent. The salary increase for TALB members was part of a con-tract agreement approved by TALB and the school board. The school district also has reached a tentative contract agreement with Long Beach Chapter 2 of CSEA. That tentative agreement includes the same salary increase that teachers and non-represented employees will receive.

Legislation Advances on 11th Grade Testing

The Assembly Education Committee voted 6-0 this month in favor of Assembly Bill 1951, authored by Assemblymember Patrick O'Donnell (D – Long Beach) to allow school districts to offer college admissions tests to students for free during the school day in lieu of the state-required 11th grade assessment

"AB 1951 is about expanding access to higher education," Assemblymember O'Donnell said. "Allowing school districts the flexibility to decide the most meaningful assessments for their students will increase the number of students going to college. As a parent, a teacher and Chair of the Assembly Education Committee, I believe AB 1951 is a win for school districts and, most importantly, a win for our students."

The Long Beach Unified School District now offers the SAT for free to students during the school day, and LBUSD Superintendent

Christopher J. Steinhauser testified in support of AB 1951 at the recent Assembly Education

Committee hearing. Our school district strongly supports AB 1951 because it eliminates historic barriers to higher education," Steinhauser said. "If more students can take a college admissions test at no cost, then more students will gain access to personalized, free practice tools, and more students will earn admission and scholarships to colleges and universities.

The measure also has the support of numerous school districts and is sponsored by the California School Boards Association. A dozen other states have used or plan to use a college entrance exam as an alternative assessment to meet state and federal accountability requirements for grade 11 testing.

The bill now moves to the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

The ongoing 1 percent raise would be retroactive to July 1, 2017. The one-time, or "off schedule," payment provides 1 percent of earnings for the entire 2017-18 fiscal year. The earnings calculation for that fiscal year will include the retroactive pay.

Employees will see the ongoing 1 percent raise reflected on paychecks no later than June 22, 2018. Retroactive checks will be issued no later than June 15, 2018. Then the one-time payment of 1 percent would be issued as soon as September. The same timeline applies to CSEA members, pending school board approval of that contract on May 2. CSEA's membership has ratified that contract with a 99 percent yes vote.

Van Blom Featured In New Documentary

"Kiss the Joy: The Story of Joan Lind Van Blom," a documentary film directed and produced by Jean Strauss, will premiere at the Newport Beach Film Festival at 5:45 p.m. on Saturday, April 28 in the Lido Theatre, 3459 Via Lido, Newport Beach. Van Blom was the first U.S. woman to win an Olympic medal in women's sculling. The rowing champion also worked for 35 years in the Long Beach Unified School District as a physical education teacher and curriculum leader.

A second screening is scheduled for 7:45 p.m. Thursday, May 3 at Edwards Big Newport, 300 Newport Center Drive, Newport Beach.
