

Instructional Support Lab (ISL)

ISL is time reserved in the school day schedule where students interact with their case manager for progress monitoring and other special education supports that are written into the IEP.

- It is time for pre-teaching or re-teaching but is not time reserved for homework completion or to be thought of as a study hall.
- ISL can replace foreign language if needed daily
- ISL can also replace selected special area classes such as PE, Music, Library, Study Skills depending on the number needed each cycle

Challenge Program

Gifted services are offered through our <u>Challenge</u> program for identified students who have a GIEP:

- Challenge meets once in a four day cycle during special area classes.
- It replaces a one day special area class (example: PE, Health, Study Skills, etc).
- Students and guardians choose which class to remove from their schedule in order to take Challenge. Current case managers will gather this information for scheduling Challenge next year.




