Consequences

Level One - (Teacher/Student): Verbal correction, time out, an apology, reteach/relearn the appropriate behavior.

Level Two - (Teacher/Parent): Level One consequence plus a phone call or note home to parents.

Level Three - (Administrative): Parent notification; may also include suspension, a behavior contract, in-school suspension or other consequence as deemed appropriate.

Mallory-PBIS Purpose

The purpose of M-PBIS is:

- To teach, model and reinforce appropriate positive behaviors for our students.
- To create consistent expectations in all areas of the school.
 - To create a safe learning environment.
- To reduce disruptions to the learning process.
- To create positive interactions between the staff and students, students and students and staff and staff.
- To model positive interactions for our students.
- To create opportunities to celebrate success.



Student Recognition

Part of Mallory’s PBIS program is frequent recognition of students that demonstrate outstanding behavior throughout the day. To help reinforce positive behaviors, students may be rewarded with “Bison Tokens”, which can be turned in for classroom privileges. Students that receive Bison Tokens will also be eligible for grade level and school wide celebrations.

Celebrations

On a larger scale, monthly assemblies are held to reward students for their appropriate behavior. Our assemblies will be fun, exciting and memorable! Individual grade levels will be celebrated as well. A grade level may receive an ice cream party, or a popcorn party, maybe even something really wild, like an afternoon of games!
