Transportation History

- Historically home-school transportation not fully funded
- AB 181 and AB182 Learning Recovery Bill passed in June,
 2022
 - 22-23 final budget provides \$637 million ongoing specifically tagged for transportation
 - LEAs can be funded up to 60% of transportation costs less LCFF allocation
 - Transportation Plan required for reimbursement

TCUSD Board Policy

Policy 3540: Transportation

- The district does not provide home-to-school transportation for regular education students.
- Appropriate transportation services will be provided for students with disabilities as specified in the student's individualized education program (IEP) or accommodation plan. The district shall make home-to-school transportation available for these students at no cost to parent/guardians as specified in the student's IEP.

Due to the boundaries of Temple City Unified School District, each school is very accessible to all students.

We provide transportation for students with disabilities as identified in their IEP, Foster Youth, and McKinney-Vento Youth.
