- V. Review TSSP and Land Trust Budget
  - a. Goal 1: 66% of students in grades 1-3 will show typical or higher progress on the End of Level (EOY) Acadience Reading Pathways to Progress
  - b. Goal 2: 85% of students in grades K-6 will demonstrate proficiency at 80% or higher on a grade level common assessment in Mathematics.
  - c. Goal 3: Implement STEM teaching and learning processes into every classroom to create a comprehensive STEM learning environment for students. 82% of students in grades 4-6 will demonstrate proficiency at 80% or higher on a grade level common assessment in science.
  - d. Current budget allocations were discussed such as funds for Reading T.A.s, Math T.A.s, and special programs like Infini-D Lab, VEX Robotics, and Mystery Science.

- e. Land Trust budget has carried over funds that must be spent. Ideas on ways to spend the overage were generated.
  - i. Hiring another full-time 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher to help lower the student-to-teacher ratio will move forward. Purchasing SIPPS reading intervention program was also approved. Current Reading T.A.s will be trained on the program and conduct the interventions.
  - ii. An idea that will be explored is purchasing a school subscription to Generation Genius as a science resource.

  - a. Request a list for parents outlining free resources that are available to them for student academic help such as Reading Rockets, Prodigy, Dreamscapes, UEN, etc.
  - b. Query into the possibility of using Learning to Breathe curriculum with WB's 6<sup>th</sup> grade students
