GREETINGS – MR. TODD SEIS

Mr. Seis greeted everyone and started the meeting.

MINUTES FROM THE LAST MEETING – MR. TODD SEIS

Minutes were shared with the committee.

Seconded by: Mr. Mitch Aten

Motion passed with all Ayes.

HALF CENT SALES TAX COLLECTION UPDATE – Mr. TODD SEIS

Mr. Seepersaud was not able to attend the meeting. Mr. Seis shared the update for Fiscal Year (FY) ended June 30, 2022.

- \$1.6 million increase over the same time, last year.
- Collections so far for FY23 are \$19.5 million.

FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 23 MONTHLY EXPENDITURE SUMMARY - MR. TODD SEIS

- \$34.5 Million is expended to date for the current fiscal year.
- Budget Amount: \$183.9 million

CHECKBOOK DATA AS OF FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2023 - Mr. TODD SEIS

- Total expenditures from Inception of the referendum through Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2023: \$268.3 million.
- Ms. Bishop inquired about the status of the Science Classroom Remodeling which is currently showing \$0 expenditure in that category.
- Some work has been done but it was not done using the half-cent monies.
- Dr. Johnson to survey middle and high schools to see what needs are there to improve our classrooms.
- Mr. Aten mentioned using \$8 million set aside for science classroom remodeling and use that money
 to make classroom improvements. He also shared that technology dollars also should be spent
 appropriately instead of them just sitting around.
- Mr. Seis reminded everyone of the rising costs of construction. Dr. Johnson shared the cost of renovations and improvements have almost doubled in price.
- Following new staff introductions were made:
 - Mr. Ron Young, Director of Planning and Construction
 - o Mr. John Kraft, Director of Maintenance and Operations
- Ms. Bishop asked the Technology amount of \$135 million being used correctly. For example, for the
 one-to-one devices. Her concern is that perhaps the money spent is not being recorded. Mr. Derek
 Mason to provide an update on that.
- Mr. Aten: This provides another opportunity for possibly reallocating the dollars from the original referendum categories.

CAPITAL OUTLAY FULL TIME EQUIVALENT (COFTE) – Mr. TODD SEIS

- Explanation of COFTE was provided.
- Department of Education publishes a COFTE number which is the best estimate of where they think
 VCS is going to be. COFTE is really a traditional school student that actually sits in a brick and mortar
 school. It does not include virtual students, charter schools and scholarship students.
- Volusia has a number of small elementary schools that are aging.
- Ms. Doster shared that the projections are showing a slight increase for next year. Her numbers are based on enrollments. Growth is anticipated in scholarship programs not necessarily in tradition programs.
- Mr. Mather: How does the enrollment numbers compare to available student stations?
- Request to share the Capacity charts at the next meeting.
- We are a state of choice. As long as we have capacity at a certain school and a student wants to transfer to that school, they can. It can be for a special program or just because they want to go and play there for the football team.

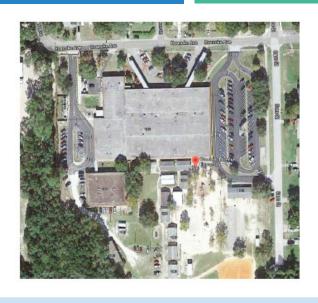
