



\$5000 Pathway to Teaching Grant

Supporting PK-12 Classified Staff Members to earn a Teaching Credential

Eligibility Requirements

Alliant offers the Pathway to Teaching Grant* to those who begin an Alliant teaching credential program if they meet the following criteria:

1. Must be currently employed as a Classified Staff Member at a California public school district or county office of education that has a current Memorandum of Understanding in place with Alliant for Student Teachers and/or Teacher Interns.
2. Must hold a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited university.
3. Must be a new student who meets all Alliant admission requirements and has been fully admitted and confirmed into one of the following programs in the California School of Education for the 2022-23 Academic Year. Specifically, starting their program on one of the following term start dates:
January 9, 2023, March 6, 2023, May 1, 2023, or June 26, 2023
 - Credential in Single Subject Teaching
 - Credential in Multiple Subject Teaching
 - Credential in Education Specialist Instruction, Mild/Moderate Disabilities

**Current Alliant students are not eligible for this Grant. Only one Grant benefit may be applied to tuition. Grant is not guaranteed. Limitations and Exclusions apply. This Grant may not be combined with Alliant tuition waivers, Preferred Pricing, other Alliant-issued grants (e.g., Alliant Alumni Grant) and scholarships. The Grant is not retroactive.*

Application Requirements

All who apply for admission to Alliant are required to meet all admission, academic, professional and behavioral standards, as well as any additional requirements required by the program. All admissions decisions will be at the sole discretion of Alliant International University.

Employment Verification

Applicants must submit a completed Application for Grant verifying their classified employment status to the Alliant Admissions Department at least one (1) week prior to the start of class.

Awarding of Funds

- Award funds will be disbursed in five equal disbursements of \$1000 and will be applied only to student tuition and fee balances at Alliant International University.
- Award recipients must be enrolled full-time and must be continuously enrolled for continued eligibility for the full amount of the award.
- Students who lose eligibility as a result of extenuating circumstances may apply for reinstatement. Approval for reinstatement of grant eligibility is not guaranteed. Loss of eligibility or denial of reinstatement requests are not subject to appeal.

Note: Students may only be awarded federal aid, scholarships, and other resources up to the financial aid budget for each student. We strongly recommend that students also pursue applicable non-Alliant scholarships or grants to help reduce the amount of loans that may need to be borrowed.
