Talk Sup Week 28 Review and Preview

March 27, 2023

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup, my weekly newsletter. Please also remember that our schools will be closed for spring recess from April 3rd through April 7th.



If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, March 21, 2023, here is what you missed. Gianna Pesci, from Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) and Morgan Koonce from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) began the meeting by providing their respective Student Council Representative to the Board of



Education Reports. Next, Mr. Esposito expressed his opening remarks, as did Mrs. Bloom,



who also shared some district highlights. During the presentation portion of the meeting, the Board celebrated the New Jersey Cheer and Dance Coaches Association State Championship Middle School Competition Cheer Team. It also heard a presentation by the SWMHS students who are currently participating in the Borough Council Student Internship program. Finally, Ms. Hill, Business Administrator, provided a brief synopsis of the 2021-22 Annual



Comprehensive Financial Report and Auditor's Management Report. To view it, click here.

The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Agenda, click here. To see the Agenda Addendum, click here. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE approved a resolution authorizing the district to refund all or a portion of the outstanding callable Series 2013 Refunding School Bonds issued in the original principal amount of \$28,725,000 and dated February 21, 2013. In addition, the Board approved and accepted the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and Auditor's Management Report for the 2021-2022 school year with no recommendations, noting this report includes the annual audit as prepared by Suplee, Clooney & Company. To read each, click on them. It also approved the submission of the 2023-2024 Preschool Expansion Aid (PEA) Enrollment and Budget Workbook, in the amount of \$10,458,898. Lastly, the Board of Education awarded the bid for HVAC at the Truman Elementary School and the second floor of the Sayreville War Memorial High School to Sunnyfield Corporation as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$10,173,000 for bids opened on March 14, 2023, to be paid using funds from the Bond Referendum.



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On the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, among other motions, the BOE approved the long-term suspensions of several students, as well as a Garden Club at the Sayreville Middle School, with Merritt Hoadley as the advisor. Likewise, on the Governance portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved new and revised board of education policies and regulations for a Second Reading and adoption. It also approved the revised 2022-23 School District Calendar, which essentially makes April 21, 2023, a school holiday in observance of Eid al Fitr. To take a look at it, click <a href=here. Furthermore, the BOE approved the revised <a href=Director of Curriculum and <a href=Instruction and Assistant Director of Food Services Job Descriptions. To view each, click on them.

On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2022-23 school year. Likewise, the Board approved the transfer of certificated staff for the 2022-23 school year. In addition, it appointed advisors and coaches for the 2022-23 school year. Furthermore, the BOE appointed faculty to work in the Samsel Upper Elementary School (SUES) STEM/STEAM and LAL Enrichment Program.

During the Open Public Comment portion of the meeting, a parent who refused to give his name or address, expressed his concerns about the traffic and congestion on Washington Road during the arrival and dismissal of high school students, which he believes is causing a safety hazard. During the Board Discussion portion of the meeting, Ms. Hill reviewed what was discussed during the last Finance and Infrastructure Committee Meeting, as did Mrs. Pieloch for the last Personnel Committee Meeting. Mrs. Bloom shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association, as did Mr. Fernandez regarding the Sayreville/South Amboy Rotary Club.

The next meeting, which will be our Special "Let the Children Lead" Business Meeting, will take place at 7:30 pm tomorrow, Tuesday, March 28th in the SUES Board Room. During this meeting, the BOE and Central Administration will be joined by almost two dozen 5th graders from the SUES as part of the annual "Let the Children Lead" program. During this very popular and unique activity, the selected 5th grade students will perform in the capacity of a specific board of education member or administrator. Thus, except for a few occasions, the 5th grade representatives for each, including Ms. Coglianese, Principal of SUES, and Mr. Tola, Assistant Principal of SUES, will vote and comment publicly on behalf of the BOE member or administrator that they will represent. 
