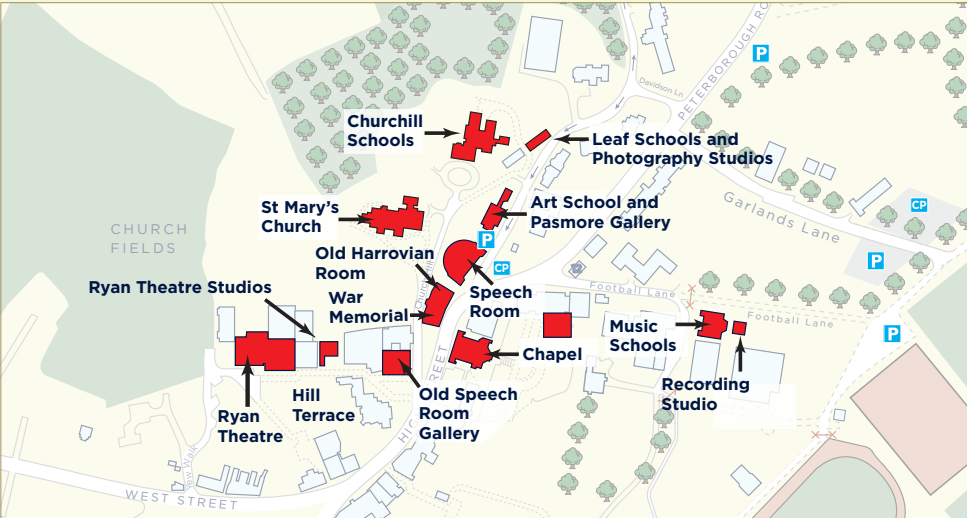
The glorious days of summer are captured in this engaging display about cricket played both on the Hill and at the annual match at Lord's.
