BHS RECOGNIZED AS A BEST HIGH SCHOOL



For the seventh year in a row, Bergenfield High School has been ranked among the top 5% of high schools in the nation by *U.S. News & World Report*. Bergenfield High School was recognized as 1226th in the nation, 52nd in the state, and 15th in Bergen County in the latest rankings.

The "2022 Best High Schools" rankings include data on nearly 24,000 public high schools in 50 states and the District of Columbia. Nearly 18,000 schools were ranked on six factors based on their performance on state assessments and how well they prepare students for college.

The criteria and weights used for ranking schools this year included college readiness (30%), college curriculum breadth (10%), state assessment proficiency (20%), state assessment performance (20%), underserved student performance (10%), and high school graduation rate (10%).


