We've been working extremely hard over these two weeks getting to grips with new learning in English and Maths as well as a new topic within our Geography work. In English, we have started reading Escape to Pompeii and used this as a stimulus to learn about the 7 different types of pronouns (bonus parent points if anyone can e-mail me the 7 without Google!) and how these help our sentences and paragraphs flow. In Maths, we have started multiplying two digit numbers by one digits using resources, drawings and partitioning. In maths, we have continued to work on multiplying 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. Trailblazers have been wondering 'What was the legacy of the sinking of the Titanic?' They are now experts in ship health and safety!
