9. RECOGNITION

- If an employee is permanent in the District, there would be no loss of employment if their previous position is no longer available.
- Probationary employee evaluations are currently done twice a year. Dr. Salgado affirmed the district is working with OFTSE during contract negotiations to increase the number of evaluations to allow for helpful feedback for improvement.
- Dr. Salgado affirmed OUHSD can dismiss probationary employees based on unsatisfactory evaluations.
- Dr. Salgado affirmed that OFTSE has an interest in clarifying language but Trustees have the authority to govern the process when an employee would achieve permanency.

Motion: Trustee Baker Torres moved to approve the revisions to Board Policy 4216: *Probationary/Permanent Status* [First Reading], as presented. Seconded by Trustee Flores-Haro and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

14. ACTION ITEMS

A. Consideration of Approval of the Second Interim Budget, Fiscal Year 2022-23

Motion: Trustee Botello moved to approve the Second Interim Budget, Fiscal Year 2022-23, as presented. Seconded by Trustee Flores-Haro and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

- OUHSD is running a balanced budget this fiscal year.
- Ms. Thomas doesn't foresee the district not being able to run a balanced budget next fiscal year, but accounting is just starting next year's projections.
- Ms. Thomas affirmed this year's pay increase is included in next year's projections, and no additional pay increase is projected other than committed step and column increases.

B. Consideration of Adoption of New Job Description: *Coordinator Community Schools* [First Reading]

Motion: President Sher moved to adopt a new job description: *Coordinator Community Schools* [First Reading], as presented. Seconded by Trustee Botello and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0

Approved

- Mr. Adams affirmed there would be one coordinator to monitor and implement the Community Schools program at CIHS and HHS.
- This position would be an administrator aligned to the Director Wellness and Inclusion.
- The job duties and responsibilities for this position would complement those of the principal and assistant principals at CIHS and HHS and would be under the direction of the Director Wellness and Inclusion.

C. Consideration of Adoption of Resolution 23-07 Proclaiming the Month of March as Women's History Month

Motion: Trustee Botello moved to adopt Resolution 23-07 Proclaiming the Month of March as Women's History Month, as presented. Seconded by Trustee Flores-Haro and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

D. Consideration of Adoption of New Job Description: *Position Control Accountant* [First Reading]

Approved

Motion: Trustee Hall moved to adopt a new job description: *Position Control Accountant* [First Reading], as presented and waive the second reading. Seconded by Trustee Botello. The motion failed with a vote of 2:3.

- Dr. Salgado affirmed Trustees were being asked for permission to create the job, not permission to hire.
- Position Control would allow for a dedicated employee to be responsible for all positions in the district and would also ensure positions aren't created without the approval from Trustees and Executive Cabinet.
- Position Control would be responsible for the technical work of the unit share calculations and AB1200.
- The permission to hire would be considered by Trustees the same night the second reading for this position is approved as there is a recruitment timeline and an urgency to fill the position.
- Dr. McCoy added that a potential candidate for review for the new Director Fiscal Services would be brought to the March 22 Board meeting. Once the start date is known, this person can be invited to sit on the panel for the position control interviews. If the position control person is hired by May or June, Ms. Thomas can be invited to be part of the transition plan.

Motion: Trustee Hall moved to adopt the new job description: *Position Control Accountant* [First Reading], as presented. Seconded by Trustee Botello and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

E. Consideration of Approval of Job Description Revisions: *Senior Payroll Technician* [First Reading]

Approved

Motion: Trustee Hall moved to approve the job description revisions: *Senior Payroll Technician* [First Reading], as presented. Seconded by Trustee Sher and carried unanimously with a vote of 5:0.

- Range 27 is the current pay range for this job.
- Trustee Botello requested to add "Spanish preferred" under "Other" at the bottom of the page.
- This position would deal with payroll only.
- The person in this position would not deal with any budgeting.

President Sher called for a break at 8:49pm and the meeting resumed at 8:59pm.

15. STAFF REPORT AND BOARD DISCUSSION

A. District AVID Programs

The Instructional Support Services Department has prepared an overview of OUHSD's AVID program, including a review of the curricula, teacher and student demographics, student performance data and areas to celebrate.

- Mr. Zamora stated he would look into why FHS doesn't have an AVID program.
- Each AVID site team meets with their principal in the spring to develop a budget plan. AVID is supported by LCAP funding but principals have flexibility in their budgets to support it too.
- Mr. Salehi added that he has funding available in the Title II budget for teachers that would like to attend the AVID summer institute.
- HHS, OHS and PHS offer AVID 9EL and 10EL this year.
- AVID 100 is currently in the draft stage to be used for SLIFE students. The plan is to have it presented to DCC in May.
- Mr. Zamora mentioned that 8th grade student recruitment was difficult last year as not all of the feeder schools allowed in person visits, but he's hopeful that numbers would increase this year. Mr. Adams added there would be information available during the preview days at the sites in August.
- Ms. Henchy affirmed data is being tracked for trade schools.
- Trustees asked if Ms. DeLosSantos can assist with individualizing the AVID program by site.

Trustees thanked Mr. Salehi, Mr. Zamora, Ms. Henchy for their presentation; they appreciate it very much.

B. DSHS Financing

Staff discussed the proposed final adjustment to the GMP for the DSHS Project, the available funding, the additional funding required, the updated timeline, potential cost reimbursements, and the need for a second amendment to the DSHS Off Site infrastructure agreement with the city of Oxnard to adjust the timeline and discuss water, sewer, and fire/life safety connections to move toward project completion. The project is expected to increase from \$179,586,539 to \$194,341,494.

- The cost increase is due to the City of Oxnard's request to make enhancements around the area of the high school and not due to construction cost increases.
- OUHSD will invoice the City of Oxnard for some road repairs the city requested of the district, approximately \$400,000 - \$1,000,000. The city is expecting the invoice.
- The developer infrastructure, \$16,801,637, is a fixed number (55% of the State Facilities Program \$30,000,000).
- Dr. McCoy thanked Tai Chau and Ken Rozell from the City of Oxnard for their communication with him on negotiating the second amendment Trustees plan to consider at a future meeting.
- The City of Oxnard is scheduled to have three City Council meetings in April. Dr. McCoy plans to notify Trustees at the March 22 Board meeting if the City Council doesn't plan to address the second amendment at one of their April meetings.
- The improvements being done around the outside of the school would allow for a safer environment for the school to operate and also help mitigate traffic factors.
- Dr. McCoy affirmed that the additional \$12,000,000 being requested in the second amendment would include furniture, fixtures and equipment and the items in phase one and two that Trustees approved. Fund 251 is being used as it's a more flexible fund and it would show how the money is assigned to this project budget.
- Trustees expressed their cost increase concerns and hope the City of Oxnard approves the second amendment.
- Dr. McCoy noted the next step after DSHS phases one and two have been completed is to install the CIHS swimming pool once Board approval has taken place.

Trustees thanked Dr. McCoy and his team for the report. He thanked Trustees for their support.

16. BOARD REPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

- Attended the "Power of Love" Planned Parenthood of California Central Coast fundraiser that was well represented by our community that supports this work.
- Attended the Family Justice Center, to be named after the late Carmen Ramirez, planning sessions.
- Encouraged all to reach out to Supervisor Long to urge her to expedite a resolution plan for the ongoing traffic issues at RMHS.
- Reported that the National Education Association highlighted OUHSD at their executive board meeting regarding OUHSD's Teach the Truth resolution.

Trustee Flores-Haro
