
Sample Content for the Kentucky State Assessment from the


"Wow, Yeh Yeh. I didn't know that," Sasha said. "He liked to draw, too?"

Sasha smiled and looked around at all her pictures on the walls. She felt happy to have given her grandfather so many memories.






How Temperature Affects Air in a Balloon

Balloon after coming out of the freezer	12 cm
Balloon at room temperature	20 cm
Balloon after being warmed for 2 min	35 cm
Balloon after being warmed for 4 min	51 cm
