

A Graduation Message

from Superintendent Steve Kramer

Good Evening. On behalf of Board of Education President **Patrick Shea**, Vice President **Tarek Kamil**, members, **Ginger Madden, Richard Palmer,** and **Cathy Swami**, along with the Administration, Faculty and Staff of Madeira City Schools, I want to also welcome you to the 94th commencement of Madeira High School.

The key to the success of our students begins at home. Tonight, I would like to take a moment to recognize and thank our parents. I also want to extend our gratitude to the grandparents of our graduates.

Graduates, have you ever stopped to look at of the senior class photos that line the front hallway of the high school? As you know, this is the 94th commencement ceremony of Madeira High School. I want to pause for a moment to let

that sink in. Think about it, there have been 93 classes from Madeira High School who stood at the door of their future just as you do tonight. Young men and young women ready for the next step of their lives, filled with the same excitement, anticipation, and yes, perhaps a bit of trepidation as you may be feeling tonight, and no doubt, just like you, hanging on every word of the superintendent – just like you are now!

I would like to recognize the proud alumni of Madeira High School by having them stand.

Graduates, we all stand on the shoulders of those who went before us. For you, Madeira graduates of yesteryear helped to build and shape the community and schools we have today. The opportunities that you have had as well as the ones ahead of you are due in a great part to those who went before you. Listen to what some graduates of past years have to say to you:

"Always smile – you never know whose day you'll brighten up and always be nice to people because it's just the right thing to do" advises **Helen Klenk Blankenship**, Class of 1947.

Jim (Deke) Decatur, Class of 1950, advises you to not always take the easy path. "You learn more from your mistakes than your successes. The tougher the choices, the more you will learn and success will follow".

Dan Henke, Class of 1951 encourages you to remember your roots and practice loyalty.

"If you want a 100% guarantee for work success, you only have to do three things", says **June Leppert Harcum**, Class of 1950. "One, know who your boss is; two, know what your boss wants; and three, do what your boss expects. But if your boss should demand or require things that are not ethical, legal or morally acceptable, get a new boss and move on!"

Les LeFevre, Class of 1960 encourages you to think outside the box, take chances, experiment with good sense and have confidence in yourself to pursue any path in life you feel worthwhile.



"Learn how to meet new people" is the advice of **James Schroth**, Class of 1951. "All the social media options don't make up for meeting people face-toface." He also encourages you to diversify your learning by getting involved. "You will be surprised how much you are taking with you and how much you have to offer."

"Treat people better than they could have been treated

anywhere else" is advice of **Wayne Morris**, Class of 1959. "When difficult situations arise, deal with them immediately and head on. Problems will come and go, and while others will often forget the problem, they will always remember how you handled it."

And finally, **Bill Case**, Class of 1949 shares his insight. "There is always something to learn from everyone. Sometimes you just need to be quiet and listen. Don't always think you need

to reinvent the wheel. Often, all you need to do is get behind it and push! There is no such thing as a free lunch, so stay motivated, be responsible, and don't expect handouts. Above all, learn from yesterday, live for today, and hope for tomorrow."

To get where you are today, you have stood on the shoulders of many who went before you, some known and some unknown. And as you were doing so, it's important for you to know that others are already beginning to stand on yours. So what is the legacy you are leaving for those who will come after you? What are the lessons others are learning from you? Well, I asked your teachers to give me some examples.

We learned that a big smile and positive attitude will go a long way from **Kevin McClanahan**, **David Dougherty** and **Desiree Gehring**. **Emily Kollmann** and **Thomas Flores** are shining examples of hard work paying off and **Grace Scheid** showed us you can improve immensely when you approach every day with a clear goal in mind.

We learned that overcoming obstacles develops perseverance and character from **Aaron Chauvette** and **Caroline Denecke** while **Hannah Roberts** showed us how taking chances can lead to opportunities you may never have considered.

Meredith Miller and **Maya Collins** showed us that some personalities take longer than others to develop and blossom, but the strong, confident results are well worth the wait while **Eric Brow, Ben Kirby,** and **Kaleb Reyes** showed us it's important to find your niche and develop your interests.

Lydia Bruemmer, Addison Cooper and Natalie Guzman demonstrated that a heart of service makes the world a better place while Rachel Chambers, Maggie Horstman and Casey Mitchell taught us looking out for others is a heartfelt gift.

I wish you God's speed.


