A Graduation Message

On behalf of Board of Education President Pat Gentile, Vice President Jay Groenke, members Kathy Hurst, Kam Misleh and David Templeton, along with the Administration, Faculty and Staff of Madeira City Schools, I want to welcome you to the 87th commencement of Madeira High School.

Graduates, there have been many people who have helped you reach the milestone we celebrate tonight. The success you have attained can be attributed to involved parents, a highly qualified teaching staff, a caring support staff and a very supportive community. Tonight, I want to take a moment to recognize three staff members who are retiring after devoting 100 years of service to education, of which 88 of those years have been serving Madeira students. Please join me in showing our appreciation for Jacque Gentile, Barb Mackris and Dianna Bartles. We wish you all a long and healthy retirement!

I enjoy books that teach lessons, especially lessons that can be applied to everyday life. One such book I came upon earlier this year is *Love Your Life And It Will Love You Back* by **Sourena Vasseghi**. His lessons are simple, yet profound, and while many of the examples he uses are centered on his quest for a family, the lessons are easily transferable to all aspects of one's life. Let me share a few of them with you:

<u>Dream Your Ideal Life</u> – If you don't know what characteristics you want in your future, you will never reach your goal. Be open to a myriad of opportunities, and be dedicated enough to your dream to either create opportunities from nothing or take advantage from great ones that come your way.

<u>Feel The Fear</u> – Vasseghi believes fear can be good as long as it motivates you to change. Learn to turn fear from something intimidating to something motivating and don't ever aspire to be fearless because fearless means letting down your guard.

<u>Make Problem Solving a Passion</u> – Make an undesirable situation more desirable. Limitations are not stop signs; they are arrows that point people in a different direction. Never underestimate what you can do, and just as important, don't overestimate your abilities either.

<u>Don't Limit Your Thinking</u> - One of the most dangerous limitations you might face is your own thinking. The worst thing that could happen is not getting a "no"; it's not trying at all.

<u>Take Advantage Of Luck</u> – Luck is the product of taking advantage of opportunities presented to you. When you nurture an optimistic and hopeful heart, you can maximize the luck that comes your way and often create your own.

<u>Trust Your Instinct</u> – Life is a series of decisions. No matter how much information you gather, you will still face unknowns. When you mix rational decision making with your instincts, you'll choose what's right for you in the long run.

And finally, <u>Be Open To</u>
<u>New Experiences</u> – If
you don't take risks, then
nothing good or bad
will ever happen to you.
To live your dreams, you
must accept the fact you'll
experience difficult days.



Don't get used to a bad situation but instead, let it get under your skin. That way you're more likely to make a change.

I think we would all agree these are worthy lessons. However, I think I should tell you a little bit more about the author. You see, Mr. Vasseghi, a graduate of the University of Southern California, who serves as a life coach for business leaders as well as a motivational speaker, was born with a severe case of Cerebral Palsy. This physically crippling handicap makes him dependent on others to complete even the basic of life's functions – to dress, to eat, to interpret his speech and, yes even to use the bathroom. If anyone has a right to have a negative, "poor me" outlook on life, Mr. Vasseghi certainly does. But instead, he sees the glass not only as half full, but overflowing. His optimistic view is an inspiration to all who know about him, making his life lessons even more meaningful.

Graduates, you have learned many lessons thus far in your life. Your parents and grandparents, uncles and aunts, sisters and brothers, friends and classmates, teachers and coaches have all taught you important life lessons. But, I believe it is also important for you to know that there have been lessons we have learned from you as well. As I have done with previous graduating classes, I asked your teachers from elementary school through high school to share some of the lessons they have learned from you. Here are just a few examples:

From **Collin Benz** we have learned that leadership through joking and teasing can sometimes be the most effective, while **Lauren Christman** showed that quiet leaders do not go unnoticed.

Karen Bullock taught us that determination and organization are the building blocks behind every successful woman while Sienna Gregory showed us anything can be accomplished with hard work and determination. David Kunkel proved that taking risks, pushing the envelope and staying true to oneself pays off and from Lauren Dehan we learned to be humble while excelling in the classroom as well as the field of competition. Max Medert showed that those who put a piece of themselves into what they create will produce beautiful images that are remembered, while Alex Whitton taught us that sometimes it is better to listen with your heart and eyes.

Katherine Herndon encouraged us to just suck it up when facing a challenge! Kaitlyn Brock showed us how passion can help us move outside our comfort zone and from lan Horwitz we learned to look beyond first impressions. And Sam Wallace showed us, that to live life to the fullest, you need to dance like no one is watching, sing like no



one is listening and love like you will never be hurt. Good advice for all of us. Whether through competitions, performances, or service to others you all reminded us of what can be accomplished through hard work, determination and compassion for others.

One of your teachers reminds you that you have experienced large and small problems that caused worry; difficult decisions that were burdensome; awkward moments or consequences that were humbling; and hopefully happy times that balanced the sad times. You have grown into young men and women with opportunities and choices ahead. You have had the encouragement of family and friends and a record of personal experiences that will bring you strength in character as you begin this next chapter of your life. The excitement of challenge and decision-making is yours to shape and direct.

Graduates, you have learned many valuable lessons these past eighteen years or so, and while I encourage you to continue to be mindful of the lessons you are learning; I challenge you to be even more mindful of the lessons you are teaching. I wish you God's speed.
