The scholarships were established thanks to a generous donation from the estate of Homer O. Amos a long-time Madeira resident and business owner who was proud of his sons' graduations from Madeira High School in the early 1970's. When Mr. Amos passed away in 2016 at the age of 90, his generous gift of close to \$785,000 provided the foundation the unique Made in Madeira Scholarship has been built on.

As you know, Madeira is an incredibly special place. Students, your parents and this Madeira community have supported you each step of the way. This scholarship reads Being Made in Madeira is not about how you start, it's how you finish. It's not only about who you are but who you can become. 




