On behalf of Board of Education President **David Templeton**, Vice President **Patrick Shea**, members **Kam Misleh**, **Tarek Kamil** and **Cathy Swami**, along with the Administration, Faculty and Staff of Madeira City Schools, welcome to the 89th commencement of Madeira High School. Graduates, there have been many people who have helped you reach the milestone we celebrate tonight. The success you have attained can be attributed to involved parents, a highly qualified teaching staff, a caring support staff and a very supportive community. Tonight, I want to take a moment to recognize five staff members who are retiring after devoting 155 years of service to education, of which 107 of those years have been serving Madeira students. Please join me in showing our appreciation for **Carol Ladrigan**, **Karen Everman**, **Don Cartisano**, **Rita Kearns** and **Ray Spicher**. We wish you all a long and healthy retirement! I also want to thank the senior class officer for their outstanding leadership this year. Please help me thank **Cari Rusk**, **Bridget Walsh**, **Caroline Jackson** and **Kristin Rayner**.

In a few short minutes, you will officially be a high school graduate. After years of hard work on your part with I am certain, a fair amount of assistance from your parents and teachers, you are ready for the next stage of your life. You have learned the causes of WWII, how to use the Pythagorean Theorem, more vocabulary words than you knew existed, a language other than English, and how to dissect a pig. You have had memorable experiences on the stage and on the field of competition. You have demonstrated what you have learned on countless tests and through projects and presentations. It is important to always set two alarm clocks (or more) to make SURE you wake up on time is something we learned from **James Booth**, while **Ben Linser** taught us how to live in the moment and not look ahead too much to the future.
