MADE IN MADEIRA

A special scholarship for every Madeira graduate

Every member of the MHS Class of 2021 attending a college, university, career training program or entered the military received a \$250 Made in Madeira Scholarship. They are the fourth class in Madeira Schools history to receive this unique award. The Made in Madeira scholarships were made possible by a generous donation from the estate of Homer O. Amos. A WW II Veteran and long-time Madeira resident and business owner, Mr. Amos was proud of his sons and their graduation from Madeira High School in the early 1970's. Madeira's local TV repairman and laundromat owner, he was also an avid investor who was successful in managing and growing his assets but who in many ways lived a simple and modest

life. He passed away in 2016 at the age of 90, and as part of his final wishes had his estate shared with Madeira High School graduates. Mr. Amos' generous gift of \$750,000 provided the foundation of the Made In Madeira Scholarships. In his own words, Mr. Amos stated, "It is my wish that the benefits from the scholarship funds be available to as many students as practicable for college tuition and expenses." The criteria to receive a scholarship is simple; students must have completed all MHS graduation requirements, be in good behavioral standing and be pursuing a college / university program, military or postsecondary / vocational program. Each student receiving the Made in Madeira Scholarship must understand the importance Mr. Amos believed being a Madeira High School graduate carries. Since 2018, donations to the fund ranging from \$10 to \$2,500 have added to that foundation and the legacy of Homer Amos.

Each year when the graduates receive a Made in Madeira t shirt with word of their scholarships, Superintendent Kenji Matsudo tells the students, "I know of no other public high school in the State of Ohio who is able to offer this kind of an opportunity to each and every one of their graduates. Being Made in Madeira is not just about what you say, but it's what you do. Being Made in Madeira is not about how you start, it's how you finish. It's not only about who you are but who you can become. Being Made in Madeira is not about getting, it's about giving. And if things aren't quite perfect or you've hit a roadblock or a bump along life's journey being Made in Madeira means that it's never too late to change your path or course of direction because above all else, being Made in Madeira means that you never, ever give up."
