To the Class of 2022:

"It's my privilege at this time to share an important scholarship started a few years ago known as the Made in Madeira Scholarship. We've witnessed the hard work of so many students but the fact of the matter is each and every one of our graduating seniors is uniquely special.

I'm pleased to share with you that each and every graduate will be eligible to receive the Made in Madeira Scholarship on behalf of the estate of Homer Amos. Mr. Amos was a long time Madeira community member who bequeathed his entire estate to two high schools his own high school back in Richmond, Virginia and Madeira High School where his sons attended school back in the early 1970's. Mr. Amos was the local TV repairman who worked out of his shop on Camargo Road. He lived a modest life, was an avid investor, and in the spirit of being proud that his sons graduated from Madeira endowed what is now known as the Made in Madeira Scholarship with a \$785,000 gift for graduating Madeira High School seniors. In his own words, "I bequeath my estate to Madeira High School for the purposes of establishing college scholarships to aid graduating students. It is my wish that the benefits from the scholarship funds be available to as many students as practical to further their academic and career pursuits."

Each and every one of our seniors have worked hard to get to this point and we want to celebrate each and every one of them with the Made in Madeira Scholarship, as a part of Mr. Amos' wishes. This endowment has been set up in such a way that it will live on for forever, as each Madeira graduating senior who is attending college, entering the military, or enrolling in a career or technical training program will be given a \$300 scholarship. The legacy of this gift will continue to grow over time as alumni, staff members, and friends of Madeira have also added gifts to this extraordinary scholarship fund. I know of no other high school in the state of Ohio where every graduating senior is awarded a monetary scholarship.

As you know, Madeira is an incredibly special place. Students, your parents and the Madeira community have supported you each step of the way. This scholarship reads, "Being Made in Madeira is not about how you start, it's how you finish. It's not only about who you are but who you can become. Being Made in Madeira is not about getting, it's about giving. And if things aren't quite perfect or you've hit a roadblock or a bump along the way, being Made in Madeira means that it's never too late to change your path or course of direction. Above all else being Made in Madeira means that you never, ever give up."
