



About the District

Triad's mission is to provide the highest quality education possible to all of its students. Currently, K-12 students number 1,060. As a district, Triad has great community and parent support. PTO and booster groups are active within the district.

The district is comprised of Triad High School 9-12, Triad Middle School 4-9, and Triad Elementary K-4. The district employs 78 certified employees and 39 classified as well as 7 administrative professionals and 4 classified administrators.

Triad Local School District serves students from Champaign, Logan and Union Counties. It is one of the public school districts served by the Madison-Champaign County ESC, which provides a variety of services to its member districts including those for gifted and special needs. Students who wish to include technical or vocational subjects in their high school curriculum may attend classes at Ohio Hi-Point Career Center. There is also an option of taking classes on line through the Virtual Learning Academy.

In 2007-2008, Triad District was rated "effective" by the Ohio Department of Education. The board of education will work to employ a superintendent with the skills and abilities to guide the district to an "excellent" rating.

Background Information

Triad District is located in the middle of the four communities it serves: Cable, Mingo, North Lewisburg, and Woodstock. When the three districts consolidated, a new school was built in 1957 in a rural location equal distance from each town and renamed Triad. An OSFC project completed in 2002 resulted in a renovated elementary and middle school, along with the construction of a new 9-12 high school.

The Triad Local School District is a part of the Madison-Champaign County Educational Service Center and the Ohio Hi-Point JVS. It comprises some 83 square miles and serves a rural community located in 3 counties (Champaign, Logan, Union).

North Lewisburg is located on State Route 245 between West Liberty and Marysville. Urbana is approximately 15 miles away.
