2022 Articulation Agreement Between Central Penn College & Eastern Center for Arts and Technology

Central Penn College and Eastern Center for Arts and Technology agree to enter a collaborative relationship that will enable these institutions to more effectively meet the educational needs of students by eliminating course duplications. Students enrolled at Eastern Center for Arts and Technology are able to gain credits for Central Penn courses that will lead to an Associate or Bachelor of Science degree at Central Penn College, maximizing transferable credits. The Transfer Agreement is designed to facilitate Eastern Center for Arts and Technology students' ease of transfer into Central Penn College. This credit provision will apply to all Central Penn College locations.

Further, Central Penn College and Eastern Center for Arts and Technology enter an articulation agreement, pertaining to the items outlined above. Under the articulation agreement, Eastern Center for Arts and Technology students who successfully complete agreed upon courses will be guaranteed credits towards admissions into an Associate or Bachelor's degree program upon completion of the agreed upon courses. The agreement seeks to ensure that secondary students have successfully completed the secondary component and acquired the skills necessary to apply for admission to Central Penn College and for enrollment into a degree program of interest to the student, thereby eliminating the need to pursue duplicative courses.

This agreement is not intended to and does not create any contractual rights or obligations with respect to the signatory parties.

Joint Responsibilities

- 1. Consult with each other through appointed personnel, prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this agreement.
- 2. Collaborate in providing students with information and academic advising about this agreement.
- 3. Cooperate in the annual review of current articulated curricula and redesign the content of the articulation as appropriate.

Central Penn Responsibilities

- 1. Central Penn College will provide transfer information, admission, and financial aid services.
- 2. Central Penn College will notify Eastern Center for Arts and Technology immediately of any curriculum changes.
- 3. Central Penn College will notify Eastern Center for Arts and Technology of any relevant programs that may become available at Central Penn College.

Eastern Center for Arts and Technology Responsibilities:

- 1. Eastern Center for Arts and Technology will ensure that the guidance counselor or the teacher of the course attests to the student's competency in the courses that have been articulated.
- 2. Eastern Center for Arts and Technology will notify Central Penn College of any new programs that the school may institute that they may consider a similar curriculum should one not currently exist.

Special Provisions regarding Eligibility:

All prospective students who have graduated from Eastern Center for Arts and Technology, who have successfully completed the academic and technological competencies for the agreed upon course, and who enroll at Central Penn College within one academic year following high school graduation are eligible to receive college credits for up to a maximum of four (4) courses, twelve (12) credits, providing these requirements have been met:

- 1. The high school student has received a grade of "B" or higher in each course to be articulated.
- 2. The course to articulate meets the competencies and performance objectives of Central Penn College.
- 3. The high school student's course teacher or guidance counselor recommends in writing that Central Penn College give credits to the articulating student for the course work.

Length of the Agreement:

Upon approval by each institution, this agreement commences and continues in force, until either party desires termination. The agreement may be terminated by either party through written notification allowing for a ninety-day notice of termination. Both parties agree to review curricular content annually. Parties have agreed to install addenda related to additional programs and developments in the agreement.
