- **By-laws – Vision Statement – Talked about the changes to the LICC manual, and the most recent draft does not include bylaws and the team decided to not continue to pursue the vision statement and movement on the bylaws at this time. Team agreed that the focus of the next LICC meeting would be to align our tasks to the goals: Children enter school ready for success, Early learning services are coordinated, and Children are raised in stable and attached families, which are in alignment with the Yamhill Early Learning Hub.**
- **SICC Annual Report-**

Reviewed the annual report. Team discussed the potential for the funding increase and the opportunity to collaborate on the input from LICC. Adequate services levels were discussed. Team asked if there was data on how many children are at moderate to high level of need (delayed in 3-4 areas), and if this data could be looked at for Yamhill county. Team also discussed current funding levels to carry into next year. Team discussed how to focus on the students placed at home prior to their kindergarten year. Team discussed the concerns around potty training. can we do that with our current funding

Team discussed child find activities regarding Kindergarten registration, the Newberg Safety fair, and other community events.

Team talked about children in foster care and children impacted by trauma, discussed the differences between mental health needs and special education needs and the importance of how the children that may not qualify are continued to be monitored by DHS and re-referred if there continue to be concerns.

- Yamhill County EI/ECSE Updates – Data

Discussed that data would be shared at the next meeting, as the data set was not available at this time.

- Input for 2019-2020 EI/ECSE Services

Numbers would be helpful – Yamhill – data for adequate service levels

Smaller communities – feedback what are you seeing in other behavior challenges, - services that you would like to see – Focus on services and looking for input from districts on what areas are needed to focus on when kids enter kindergarten.

Discussed trends around concerns around toileting, parent knowledge and readiness on potty training child, societal influences on the need to be potty trained.

Team discussed screenings and the possibility of screenings for EI was being reviewed by legislature. Team shared ideas how this could expand child find activities.
