I learnt that the U11 boys were crowned South West ESFA football champions this week and, not to be outdone, the U11 girls swept all before them in the rain yesterday to become regional champions – both superb achievements.

Undoubtedly for me though, the sporting highlight of this week was watching the U13 boys at the Rosslyn Park Sevens yesterday. They were outstanding all day, winning every match. 

This week's Picture of the Week is this excellent experimental drip painting by **Max E.**




JUNIOR AWARDS




HUMANITIES AND LANGUAGES

Year 6 at Villa Ventorum, The Newt

We were delighted to take all of Year 6 to the recently opened Villa Ventorum at The Newt, Bruton for the first time. This has been months in the planning for party leaders Mr Sweet and Mrs Crispin and the first cross curricular trip we have arranged together. Thanks to the support of Mrs Newman and the Year 6 staff, we were able to arrange a full day of learning onsite and in collaboration with Mrs Everett and the schools team at The Newt, tailor the programme to the IP unit Moving Places. This focus on the Romans and the ways they lived fitted superbly into a day that comprised guided tours of the villa itself, workshopping in the state of the art museum and outdoor classroom activities delivered by our staff in the afternoon.

The day began with a welcome from the staff at The Newt dressed in Roman costume and setting out the busy programme for the day ahead in the atrium of the museum. Pupils were divided into their form groups with half the group touring the Roman Villa whilst the other group were given a guided tour of the finding of the museum. One of the most remarkable aspects of the site has been the sheer number of archaeological discoveries they have made as well as the exactness and attention to detail in every room of the Villa. Our students were given student booklets to complete, a range of up to 10 activities through the morning including how to weave, make mosaics and to shop using the Roman currency and their Latin skills amongst many other learning opportunities. Millfield Prep are one of the very first groups to be invited to the Villa Ventorum and the school had exclusive access for the entire morning.



During the morning sessions, the Year 6 pupils were truly immersed in the Roman world. To be able to stand on the glass floor and look down at the site whilst being given an in depth talk about the Roman Baths, cold storage and many other uses of the Villa was impressive. They understood how to ask questions of the archeology around them, asked their own questions and drew upon their prior knowledge of the Romans. The many layers and uses of each room from small fragments of tile, pottery and baked rock tell us enormous amounts about the world of Lindinius Civitius, (Roman West Country) during the Roman occupation and after the Romans left from 410 CE. The interactive displays that were on offer in the museum allowed students to understand the geography of Roman Somerset, how the Romans traded, and were able to build structures that were highly advanced. Indeed the Villa Ventorum has been painstakingly reconstructed from the archilogical evidence from the latest dig down to the very details of the kitchen and to the frigidarium. The Villa even has the only working hypocaust in the world that provides under floor heating to each room such is the level of detail that students saw on their tour.

We were also very fortunate to have Miss Parsons and Mr Maxwell, Heads of Science and Art respectively, who were able to provide afternoon workshops inspired by the morning sessions. Pupils designed sun dials, completed their own mosaics and were able to ask a range of questions that highlight just how much they had taken in on their visit to Villa Ventorum. The trip itself benefited enormously from Year 6 teachers, Mr McNulty and Mr Churchill been able to link what they learnt in class directly to what they were seeing at the Villa Ventorum. The fact that the Roman Villa is only thirty minutes from Millfield Prep means we have been able to develop this bespoke, cross curricular trip that incorporated Humanities, Science, Latin and Art. We also wanted to add our thanks to all the Year 6 pupils who represented the school superbly and as such, we hope to be able to return next year.






HOLLIES

The children have been busy exploring forces this week and wanted to experiment with ramps. 
FISHING FOR SOUNDS
