Registration for 2023-2024

Please continue to enroll your child(ren) online for the 2023-2024 school year. Remember that any returning student and/or new student will need to register online. If you need assistance with your Skyward account, please contact the front office. The registration window will be open until April 30th. It is imperative that your student(s) be registered by that time so that we may plan for next year's staffing and be able to assign your student to a teacher for the 23-24 school year! Please note, your registration is not considered complete until all documents have been received.

•Be sure to locate your 2 proofs of residency (utility bills or mortgage/lease statements), dated January 2023 or later, which you can upload electronically with your registration or drop off at the school once your registration is complete.

•Kindergarten registration is also open to our families with rising kindergarteners. Kinder students will also need an updated immunization form and proof of physical dated within the last year.

Our hearts and thoughts go out to Nashville Covenant School

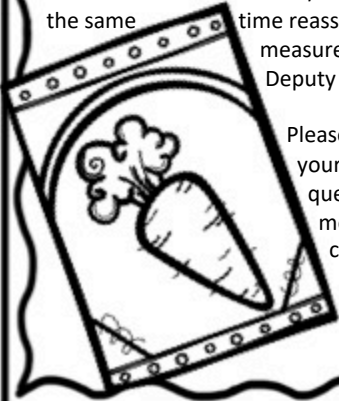
The incredibly tragic event at Nashville's Covenant School has effected all of us in our MES and local communities. For your child, his/her sense of safety and security has been challenged. Here are some things to consider to help your child:

-Limit exposure to information: Be diligent in protecting your child from too much and/or non-age appropriate information. It is always best for them to hear difficult news and information from you in a manner that best suits them.

-Check-ins: Once they are aware be sure to ask them what they have heard and how they are feeling.

-Honest and brief facts: It is so crucial for your child to have accurate facts and his/her questions answered. At the same time reassure them that safety measures are in place at MES (ie. Deputy Osborne)

Please be sure to let me know if your child shares concerns or questions that you would like me to address. We want your child to feel as safe as possible, even when the world around them may not feel that way.

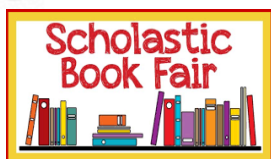
Spring Scholastic Book Fair April 3-6

Notes from Nurse Sanders:

It's a beautiful day – the sun is shining, the birds are chirping. What could be more perfect than a skateboard, skate, or bike ride? But wait... before you hop on let's remember how to stay safe on wheels!

Grab your helmet

- Make sure it fits properly
- Wear it correctly

Check your equipment

- Make sure your tires are properly inflated
- Be sure your brakes work

Be aware

- Watch for road hazards like pot-holes, puddles, rocks, or animals
- Always keep two hands on the handlebars of your bike
- Obey all traffic laws



The Facts:

Helmets reduce the risk of head injury by at least 45%, brain injury by 33%, facial injury by 27%, and fatal injury by 29%. (*Journal of Psychology; Journal of Safety Research*)

Every year, 26,000 children are seen in emergency departments for traumatic brain injury related to bicycle-riding. (*Centers for Disease Control and Prevention*)

Apart from the automobile, bicycles are tied to more childhood injuries than any other consumer product. (*Saving Children: A guide to injury prevention*)

If it has wheels... wear a helmet!
