SESSION ONE - Opening

1.0 - Opening

1.1 - Call to Order

President Brown called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

1.2 - Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

SESSION TWO - Special Presentations

2.0 - Special Presentations

Dr. Linda Wagner, Superintendent, and Linda Hopkins, Director of Student Services, Keppel Union Elementary School District in Pearblossom, made a special presentation to Ray Culberson, Director of Student Services. Mr. Culberson was recognized for the outstanding presentation he gave to their school district staff.

2.1 - Commemoration of Dieciseis de Septiembre

Upon motion by Member Parra, seconded by Member Savage, and approved by the affirmative vote of Members Brown, Dupre, Parra, Penman, Savage, and Tillman (Noes: None: Absent for Vote: Valdez), the following was adopted:

WHEREAS the 16th of September is an important date in the history of Mexico that marks the anniversary of the issuance of the *Grito de Dolores* in which Fr. Miguel Hidalgo defied Spain and called for freedom and justice for the common man; and

- **WHEREAS** such concern for the rights of all people as exemplified in *El Grito* are in keeping with the precepts of this country and the aspirations of people of good will throughout the world; and
- WHEREAS this date of historical significance is respected and celebrated by many members of this community, including students of the San Bernardino City Unified School District; and
- **WHEREAS** knowledge and understanding of this holiday, its meaning, and its relationship to the history of the western hemisphere is a fit object of study within the discipline of history; and
- **WHEREAS** the knowledge and understanding of history is an important aspect of a complete education;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the San Bernardino City Unified School District duly notes the celebration of *Dieciseis de Septiembre* and directs appropriate activities for its observance take place in the schools of the District.

2.2 - Recognition of Hispanic Heritage Month

Upon motion by Member Penman, seconded by Member Parra, and approved by the affirmative vote of Members Brown, Dupre, Parra, Penman, Savage, and Tillman (Noes: None: Absent for Vote: Valdez), the following was adopted:

- WHEREAS Hispanic Americans have roots in Europe, Africa, South and Central America and have close cultural ties to Mexico and the Caribbean. This diversity has brought variety, invaluable perspectives, experiences, and values to the San Bernardino City Unified School District; and
- **WHEREAS** Hispanic Americans: Our Rich Culture Contributing to America's Future is the 2006 theme for Hispanic Heritage Month; and
- **WHEREAS** the San Bernardino City Unified School District joins others across the state and nation in recognizing the contributions of Hispanic Americans; and
- WHEREAS the San Bernardino City Unified School District celebrates the vibrant Hispanic-American spirit that influences our Nation's art, music, food, and faiths, and we also celebrate the practices of commitment to family, love of country, and respect for others, virtues that transcend ethnicity, reflect the American spirit, and are nobly exemplified in the Hispanic-American community; and
- WHEREAS the San Bernardino City Unified School District has a responsibility in promoting the knowledge and understanding that can be gained by all, regardless of race, through appropriate ceremonies and activities celebrating Hispanic Heritage;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the San Bernardino City Unified School District declares September 15, through October 15, 2006, Hispanic Heritage Month and duly notes the celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month and directs appropriate activities for its observance take place in the schools of the District.

2.3 - In Recognition of Native American Day

Upon motion by Member Brown, seconded by Member Parra, and approved by the affirmative vote of Members Brown, Dupre, Parra, Penman, Savage, and Tillman (Noes: None: Absent for Vote: Valdez), the following was adopted:

- **WHEREAS** the Southern California region was home to many generations of native peoples long before the arrival of the European explorers; and
- **WHEREAS** the native peoples of the region each held distinct cultures and traditions that bound them to the Earth and all its inhabitants; and
- WHEREAS September 22, 2006, is Native American Day, which has been celebrated in California for many years by its 107 federally recognized Indian tribes; and
- **WHEREAS** the Multicultural Education Policy of the California State Board of Education recognizes that each student deserves the opportunity to understand the common humanity fundamental to all people; and
- WHEREAS the history-social framework for California Public Schools, Kindergarten through Grade 12, states that the history curriculum of community, state, region, nation, and world must reflect the experiences of men and women of different racial, religious, and ethnic backgrounds; and
- WHEREAS educational leaders throughout the San Bernardino region are encouraged to involve themselves and their schools in a statewide focus on improving the education provided to our children about the local indigenous tribes of Southern California;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education of the San Bernardino City Unified School District duly notes the celebration of Native American Day and encourages all educators to commemorate this occasion with appropriate instructional activities.

SESSION THREE - Administrative Presentation

3.0 - Administrative Presentation

3.1 - 2005-2006 Academic Achievement Data

Dr. Paul Shirk, Assistant Superintendent, Research/Systems Analysis, presented the latest release of California's STAR test results for the 2005-2006 academic year. District scores and multi-year trends were shown with the implications for Federal NCLB (No Child Left Behind) and California PSAA (Public School Accountability Act) accountability provisions (see page __).

Dr. Shirk reported that there has been steady schoolwide API growth at the elementary level, and elementary and middle school schools maintained their AYP scores. Schools had higher scores, but the targets were higher this year. North Verdemont Elementary School left Program Improvement status after making their AYP for two years. The percentage of students proficient in all subgroups is increasing.

Elsa Valdez asked Staff to compare schools that implemented early interventions to schools that did not. Dr. Valdez requested a workshop for Board members to discuss their funding priorities. Dr. Gilleland stated that Staff is implementing a variety of interventions specific to the schools' needs and test scores. The degree of implementation is still a concern that Staff is working on.

Board members discussed the possibility of creating a Richardson-type program at a second middle school. Teresa Parra made a recommendation to include this in the plans for the new Curtis Middle School. Lynda Savage stated that parent buy-in needs to be our goal. Judi Penman stated that it is very distressing that more parents aren't involved. We need higher expectations for our students and to quit coddling them. Each student doesn't need to go to a four-year college, but they need higher education.

Mrs. Parra stated that a second Richardson program could take away the high-achieving students from the other schools resulting in lower test scores. Mrs. Savage added that the IB program at Chavez Middle School needs to be taken into account. Danny Tillman asked how to ensure a balanced student body. Judi Penman stated that there is a perception that this is a bad school district. If we have a place for our high-achieving students, they will stay in the District and our test scores will go up.

Gil Navarro, education advocate, stated that 1,000 students didn't receive a diploma because they didn't have enough credits or pass the CAHSEE. Mr. Navarro asked when we will have schools that parents can be proud of. Some schools need more money and SSTs, and action plans need to be made.

Dr. Delgado asked Board members to invite people to visit classrooms to see what remarkable things teachers have been doing. This is a very complex issue. Scores are only one indicator of what is working. Teachers are involved and we want them more involved. This is the result of Professional Learning Communities. We reallocated money for lower-achieving schools. Some

schools made great progress and none went backwards. The achievement gap is closing. Dr. Delgado is proud of teachers and administrators. We need to believe we can make improvements.

Dr. Delgado stated that at Board request, Staff can move to create a school without boundaries and lower enrollment similar to Richardson. It may be possible to use Burbank Elementary School.

SESSION FOUR - Administrative Report

4.0 - Administrative Report

4.1 - 2005-2006 Unaudited Actuals

Education Code Section 42100 requires school districts to file annual statements of all receipts and expenditures for the preceding fiscal year with the County Superintendent of Schools on or before September 15 of each year. The report is the District's unaudited actuals summary of revenues, expenditures, and ending-fund balance for all funds for the fiscal year that ended June 30, 2006, which will be submitted to the County Superintendent of Schools. All funds ended the year with a positive balance (see page ____).

Danny Tillman stated the District is in great financial shape. Mr. Tillman asked that the categorical program figures be broken out. Mr. Tillman asked why so much money is left over, why isn't the money being spent, and what can it be used for. Judy White stated that the categorical funds came in late and many vacancies weren't able to be filled. Mr. Tillman stated that this information must get to the people who can spend it and asked for a report. Marlin Brown stated that many school plans are multi-year plans. Mohammad Islam stated that they notify staff of budget changes. Dr. Delgado stated that we will bring back a report on how schools are spending their money. Dr. Brown asked Mr. Islam to explain to the Board the budget process, and to notify staff how to use and allocate it properly.

Danny Tillman stated that this report should always be agendized as a presentation in the future. Dr. Delgado reported that this will come back as a presentation.

SESSION FIVE – Other Matters Brought By Citizens

5.0 - Other Matters Brought by Citizens

Tom Hernandez, CSEA member, stated that safety could be a reason parents are transferring their students. Mr. Hernandez stated that all Building Services employees should have a fair chance for promotion. Dr. Brown stated that he always sees the results of Building Services personnel's hard work. They are making a valuable contribution to the District.

Danielle Hilder reported that Teresa Parra is the co-chair of Planned Parenthood's Women's Health Conference, November 18, 206, at California State University, San Bernardino. Last year, 200 students attended the conference. Ms. Hilder asked the Board for help in making the conference information available to students and to meet with a staff person to discuss the conference. Dr. Delgado stated that Narciso Cardona would be the District contact person. The District has been reluctant to distribute information from organizations, especially when it is controversial. We are being careful of what non-educational information we distribute. This would imply that the District is endorsing it. Judi Penman stated that she assumes it will be advertised in the newspapers.

SESSION SIX - Reports and Comments

6.0 - Report by Board Members

Teresa Parra reported that the Fall Conference was pretty cool. There are a lot of people in the District that want to do great things. Mrs. Parra asked when the Board would be receiving a presentation on a School Police retirement plan. Yolanda Ortega stated that she is waiting for a state report.

Elsa Valdez requested a Board workshop to discuss budget priorities. Dr. Delgado asked Board members if they would like to hold an extra meeting in October or to meet at 4:30 p.m. on October 3. It was the consensus of the Board to schedule a budget workshop on October 3, at 4:30 p.m.

Marlin Brown reported that a Board meeting is scheduled to be held on November 7, which is Election Day. It was the consensus of the Board to hold the meeting as scheduled, but to keep it brief.

Elsa Valdez stated that in Yucaipa School District each student had an individual plan to help them pass the CAHSEE. Dr. Valdez asked if our district had funds for individual plans, interventions, SSTs, or a modified version to help them pass the CAHSEE. Dr. Valdez would like to discuss this and the possibility of providing more resources to schools at the workshop.

Danny Tillman stated that California State University San Bernardino should be doing a better job of recruitment with local groups.

Tony Dupre invited everyone to attend a luncheon on September 16, at Shandin Hills Golf Club to welcome the new pastor and his family to St. Paul AME Church.

Tony Dupre stated that developer fees increase the cost of building homes and asked if the fees could be waived for affordable housing. Teresa Parra stated that the level of the fees is required for Hardship status. Judi Penman stated that low developer fees would be an incentive for builders to build low-income housing. Mr. Dupre asked that David Taussig and Associates include that in their review.

6.1 - Legislative Update

7.0 - Report by Superintendent and Staff Members

Dr. Delgado reported that a Youth Summit will be held on September 28, and invited Board members to attend. The summit was scheduled in response to the killing of a Rio Vista Elementary School student at King Middle School. He will speak with students from all high schools at the Summit at the Professional Development Center.

Dr. Delgado asked Board members which dates in January they would like to meet. It was the consensus of the Board to hold the meetings on January 9, and January 16, 2007.

The cost will be paid from the Restricted General Fund – Elementary Secondary Education Act, Account No. 501. All other terms and conditions will remain the same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorizes Mohammad S. Islam, Assistant Superintendent, Business and Finance, to sign said amendment.

8.80 - Amendment No. 1 to the Facilities Use Agreement with First Hotels International, Inc., (Clarion Hotel and Convention Center, nee Radisson Hotel and Convention Center) to Provide Facilities, Food, and Room Set-Up for District Staff Development

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorizes Mohammad Z. Islam, Assistant Superintendent, Business and Finance, to sign said agreement.

<u>8.81 - Amendment No. 2 to the Agreement with Edusoft, Inc., to Provide an Internet-Based Assessment and Instructional Software Platform</u>

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education ratifies amending the License Agreement with Edusoft, Inc., San Francisco, CA, to provide an internet-based assessment and instructional software platform, as approved by the Board on August 5, 2003, Agenda Item 7.24. Amendment No. 2 is necessary to extend the term of the agreement by one year and to change the license fee. The fee, not to exceed \$138,580.00, shall be paid from the Restricted General Fund – Title II Part D Technology, Account No. 516. All other terms and conditions will remain the same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorizes Mohammad Z. Islam, Assistant Superintendent, Business and Finance, to sign said amendment.

8.82 - Extended Field Trip, California Cadet Corps Program, Brigade Land Navigation Bivouac, Camp Tahquitz, Angelus Oaks, California

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education approves the extended field trip for 450 middle and high school California Cadet Corps Program students, 17 District employee chaperones, and 2 volunteer chaperones to attend the Brigade Land Navigation Bivouac, Camp Tahquitz, Angelus Oaks, California, September 15-17, 2006. The cost of the trip, approximately \$17,550.00, which includes rental of trucks to transport equipment, rental of an RV to be used as a medical station, facility admission charges, Portapotty rental, medical supplies, food, scholarships, and consumable camping supplies for the 450 students, 17 District employee chaperones, and 2 volunteer chaperones will be paid from Alternative Programs Account No. 030 and private donations. 8.83 - Extended Field Trip, Kimbark Elementary School, Arrowhead Ranch Outdoor Science School, Lake Arrowhead, California

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education approves an extended field trip for sixty-eight fifth grade Kimbark Elementary School students and four District employee chaperones to attend Arrowhead Ranch Outdoor Science School, Lake Arrowhead, CA, September 25-29, 2006. The cost of the trip, \$6,859.00, including meals and lodging for sixty-eight students and four District employee chaperones, will be paid from Kimbark Elementary School Account No. 612. *The Board does hereby order the enforcement of the expulsion suspended for a period of not more than one calendar year. The suspension of the enforcement of the expulsion order is deemed appropriate for the rehabilitation of the pupil, per Education Code section 48917.

**The Board does hereby expel the pupil for a period of one semester, and does hereby order the enforcement of the expulsion suspended for the following semester, allowing him/her to be considered for re-enrollment in the district under suspended expulsion as deemed appropriate for the rehabilitation of the pupil, per Education Code section 48917.

(S) A stipulated expulsion is a process whereby the pupil and his/her family acknowledge responsibility for the behavior leading to the recommendation for expulsion by the school administration, and waive their right to a hearing by admitting to the facts in support of an expulsion recommendation. The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, ***(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester.

8.87 - Student(s) Recommended for Suspension, but Remanded Back to School Sites or Had Suspensions Reduced, Due to Errors of Due Process, Lack of Evidence, and/or Availability of Other Means of Correction
