Behind the Wheel

Most teenagers are ready for the day when they are finally allowed to get behind the wheel. Although we all know that you have to get your learner's permit, there are several steps that must be followed beforehand. First, go to the DDS (Department of Driver Services) on 620 Country Farm Rd, Dublin, Ga 31021 and apply to take a test. Next, you will have to pass a vision test and a written exam. Drivers Education is also a requirement for all teenagers 16 and under. It will cost \$10 each time you take a written exam. To prove your knowledge of road signs and traffic laws, there are 20 traffic laws and signs you must learn. Be sure to pick up a copy of a driver's manual and begin studying these soon! Finally, you must have a School Enrollment (DS-1) from Mrs. Martin, our secretary, before taking the learner's test. After the testing is over, it's time to find a car or truck. There are many car dealerships around Dublin such as Dublin Ford Lincoln, Dublin Auto Sales, Dublin Nissan, and many used car lots. Getting a learner's permit is simple if you follow the checklist below:

- Current Certificate of Enrollment from school (if under 18 years of age)
- \$10.00 fee is paid prior to written test







No-Bake Mint Oreo Truffles

Ingredients: 1 package of mint Oreos 1 bag of semisweet chocolate chips (12 ounces) 1 package of cream cheese, softened 1-2 teaspoons of canola oil Optional: heart sprinkles How to make: Step 1: Stick a sleeve of Oreos in a large resealable bag, and use a rolling pin to

smash the Oreos into small pieces. Then, repeat for the next 2 sleeves of Oreos. Step 2: Next, mix in the cream cheese. Then, roll the mixture into quarter-size balls.

Step 3: Stick the dough balls into the refrigerator to harden for at least 20 minutes.

Step 4: Once the 20 minutes is almost over, pour the chocolate chips into a microwave-safe bowl with the canola oil, and microwave in 25-second intervals (stirring in between) until the chocolate is fully melted. *Tip: If the chocolate is thick and goopy, stir in a little more oil. Step 5: Cover the truffles in a coat of chocolate, and stick it on a parchmentlined baking sheet.

Optional: Add some heart sprinkles to make the truffles more festive. Step 6: Put the truffles in the fridge once again, and wait 20 minutes, or over night so the chocolate can harden.
