

## WLMS Student Spotlight: Cory King – 6<sup>th</sup> Grade





The student spotlight this month is Cory King. He is in sixth grader, and he says, "It's great!" However, he does miss SWLE because Ms. Baker isn't his teacher anymore. He is a very sporty person. His favorite part about middle school is going to the gym to play basketball, just like most boys who attend here! He also can throw a very good spiral in football. When he isn't at school, he enjoys playing any sport. Cory is very athletic and a kind-hearted boy who is always giving out hugs!

### AR is Gone?

I'm sure most of you have all heard the rumor that 7<sup>th</sup> grade has done away with AR; however, that is not completely true. Even though it's not required for students to read AR, there is a substitution for it. Seventh graders no longer have to go to the library and look for books directly on their Lexile's. They are no longer being "forced" to read a certain number of books nor have to get a certain amount of points. One seventh grade teacher points out that it is NOT eliminated; it is just not tied to an AR score anymore. Some seventh grade teachers think AR isn't effective at WLMS. One seventh grade teacher stated, "Students do not like being "forced" to read books simply because they are on their Lexile level, not necessarily their interest level. Students with high Lexile levels also do not have a wide selection of books from which to choose in the school library. Their only choices tend to be nonfiction science books or biographies."

Although the AR requirements have changed, they still have to read on a website. This website is called Read Theory. Read Theory provides students with higher interest reading that could be similar to the articles on the Milestone. A teacher from seventh grade doesn't fully agree with AR being replaced with Read Theory. She says that novels read by small groups on their Lexile levels would be better. On the other hand, one seventh grade student said that she likes Read Theory because the passages are shorter. Read Theory is NOT a better option, but it is providing shorter passages for students to read on their individualized Lexile level. It is still not allowing students to read on their INTEREST level!



The most common thing that everyone deals with at school is stress. We have so many tests, a lot of homework, extracurricular activities, and we don't have any time to relax. Seriously, we have mental breakdowns at least 3 times a week. Since I'm stressed all of the time, I have come up with several ways to deal with stress. To keep from getting stressed, you should try to get at least 8 hours of sleep per night. Another way is to take a bath (or shower) and light a candle or use essential oils. One WLMS student stated, "I turn on some music and reorganize my room." That is something I also do very often. One of the biggest ways to deal with stress is to play with your pet (if you have one). Playing with a pet can increase levels of the stress-reducing hormone oxytocin and decrease levels of the stress hormone cortisol. Talking to someone about what you are stressed about can help you, too. Another WLMS student stated that she has to talk to a friend to stay calm. The last way to deal with stress is to go outside and ride a bike or take a walk. The fresh air outside will make you feel better, and plus you get a work out. Trying a few of these strategies will most likely help you deal better with stress.





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#### Bible Class Mrs. Meghan Wilson







Mrs. Wilson's 8th grade Bible literature class is a class where students learn the history of the Bible and have fun activities to go along with it. Mrs. Wilson enjoys seeing her students grow in knowledge of the Bible and in their faith. There are 66 books in the Bible, and she wishes for all of her students to know them. In February, they were making scavenger hunts for one another over some books of the Bible. If you're wondering what Mrs. Wilson likes most about this class, it is discussing with the class questions they may have and learning together. Everyone works well with each other. Some activities they do in this class are watching Christian movies, memorizing scripture, putting the sixty-six in order, etc. Although this class seems pretty fun so far, Mrs. Wilson wishes that they could answer questions more efficiently and smoothly. "If there was one thing I could do to make this class even better, it would be to be more organized," she stated. We asked Mrs. Wilson if she could teach a different WIN class, would she? "Of course not!" she said. Ethan Bryner chose this class because he wanted to learn more about the Bible, and he would recommend this class to upcoming 6th and 7th graders.

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#### 8th Grade Drama Mrs. Kellie Manley & Mrs. Jessica Jones

Eighth grade drama is a WIN class where young actors are able to express themselves in ways they could not in regular classes. Lexi Ford and Evie Lee love being in drama WIN. They literally had nothing bad to say about this class; although, they did say the class could use more props. At this time, they make a lot of their own props. Currently, students are in groups writing their own plays that they eventually hope to perform. Lexi's and Evie's play is a comedy. The class so far has had a guest speaker who has been in a few movies which was really exciting for them. All of the students in the class love both of their teachers Mrs. Jones and Mrs. Manley. Other fun activities they do are performing improv, keeping straight faces, and bonding with their fellow students. They use this class to express themselves in order to become creative leaders of tomorrow.

Mrs. Manley enjoys teaching drama. She would never teach another WIN class even if given the choice. She wants to try and get to know her students on a personal level that she's not able to accomplish in the typical classroom setting. 




#### 8th Grade Animal Science Mrs. Casey Dunn

He helped the class better understand how to candle an egg. The class currently has four chickens.

I interviewed two students from this class: Kirsten Boston and Ladedry Thomas. The students chose this class because of their love for animals. They would recommend upcoming 6th and 7th graders to take this class because it is a very fun class, and you learn more than you already know about animals. They said it's also a very interesting class. They say the hardest thing to do is to candle an egg. 






## **Other Happenings Around WLMS**




