Many students have been complaining and upset about no more exemptions; however, they are COMING BACK! The board had multiple meetings and discussions about all the pros and cons of having exemptions. It was obvious that the pros outweigh the cons. One of the biggest cons of having no more exemptions was that there is now a major increase in absences. The criteria to be able to exempt from taking your finals at the end of the fourth nine weeks are the same. This includes 90 average or above in the class, no more than one discipline referral, no more than five absences, all books returned to the Media Center, and lunchroom account paid. With the Milestones at the end of the year, finals add extra stress on us students, so getting the news that exemptions are back is a huge relief. An administrator at one of the meetings stated, "The students at West Laurens Middle and High are failing more classes than they have in past years with exemptions." Furthermore, an anonymous parent at one of the board meetings quoted, "My son, who is in seventh grade and has never had any discipline referrals, has had three this school year! I feel like his behavior is because there's no reward for good behavior besides stamps for pizza or something trivial from the school store. However, he loved getting out of school to miss extra tests." With this information, the board knew this was an issue that they needed to fix. (Article continued on page 3).

Dublin's New Water Park

In Dublin, Georgia, we have the average temperature of 94 degrees during the summer. Most people have to go at least 50 miles just to cool off. Well, now the city of Dublin is building a brand new water park at Southern Pines. It will have features like two 20-foot tall water slides, a 500-foot long lazy river, a 6-lane lap pool, a small wading pool, and the splash pad. The water park opens Memorial Day weekend, May 25 and 26. It will begin operating 7 days a week starting June 1st. The park will only be open from 8 AM to 10 AM for programs like swimming lessons and senior aerobics. From 10 AM to 6 PM, the water park will be open for the public. The admission fee is a \$10 flat rate for everyone. If you are 12 years old or younger, you must have a parent present. Don't worry if you get hungry while at the park because you can choose food from an extensive list of concessions. Some of the concessions include grilled chicken sandwiches, hot dogs, hamburgers, chicken fingers, chicken wings, pizza, soft pretzels, French fries, nachos, salads, quesadillas, fountain drinks, candy, ice cream, and much more. If you want to cool off this summer, you should definitely check out the new water park.



Car Rider Line Problems

If you're one of the people who are always late in the mornings because of the long car rider line that sometimes extends all the way to the technical college, you know that the line isn't anything except ANNOYING! There are busses trying to get to the ramps, cars trying to get in the left lane, teachers trying to go to the parking lot - it's just chaotic! Some would recommend creating another lane just for busses, some may say that they need to have more traffic directors, and of course, MOST say, "Get here on time, and you wouldn't have to worry about the line." However, the WLHS Tardy Policy states, "When arriving less than 10 minutes late for a class, students are tardy. After 10 minutes, the student is considered absent for that class and needs to report to the office to sign in and receive an admission slip to class. A student is expected to be punctual to school and to classes. Being on time demonstrates a sense of personal responsibility as well as a respect for the educational process. The tardies are per 9 weeks, and they do not go away. They accumulate until the new 9 weeks starts over.

Consequences of being tardy: (1-3): no punishment, first 3 are free. (4-5) : 1 day ISS. (6-9): 2 days ISS. (10-11): 3 days ISS. (12 or more): OSS until parent conference.

Some reasons that younger kids need to learn coding is that it will prepare them for the future. It also helps them with their math, reading, writing, and creative abilities.



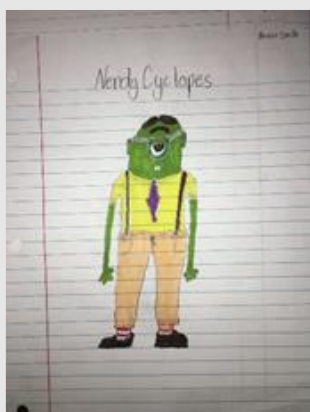
Life Skills WIN Class

WLMS Boys Track Place 2nd in Region

From Coach O’Neal & Morris Wright (assistant): Congratulations to the boy’s track team for placing 2nd at region on March 27th. Our boys fought so hard to win but fell 2 points short of gaining 1st place against Bleckley County. However, many guys met personal records, and some even broke a school record. Individual winners were Jaden Williams, who set the tone of the meet winning 1st place in discus with a throw of 129’ 05”. He was only a half inch away from beating the school record of 129-05.50. Another 1st place winner was William Kellam in the 400 meter dash with a time of 56.48. Watkinzi Norris received 2nd place in high jump with 5 ft 2 inches, Russell Graham also received 2nd in long jump with 16 ft 10 inches, Johnny Williams obtained 2nd running and jumping the 110 hurdles with a time of 15.90, Nathan Abrams got 3rd place in the 800 meter run with 2:35, Sam Reeves received 3rd in both the 1 mile & 2 mile with times of 5.37 and 11:53, Emmanuel Kwarteng recieved 3rd place in discus with a throw of 104-07.50. Our 4x100 team consisting of DJ Taylor, Russell Graham, Johnny Williams, and William Kellam received 1st place with a time of 48.94. Those same runners ran the 4x400 relay and broke the school record with a time of 3:58.36! Many other athletes contributed to the team’s overall score. 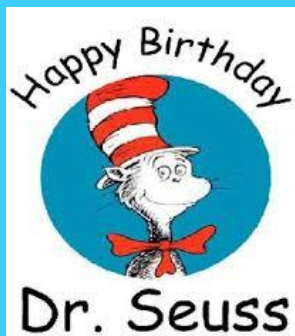

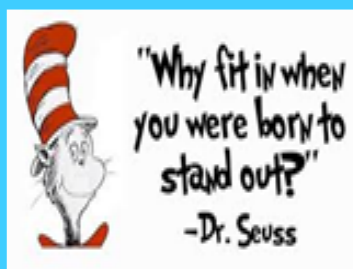

Easter Oreo Bark

Ingredients:

- 4-5 oreos crushed
- ½ cup Pastel M&Ms
- Candy Sprinkles
