### Meet our New Executive Director

### **Attendance Reminders:**

ABSENCES: Absences are excused for the following reasons only:

- I. Illness or injury requiring hospitalization, bed rest, or parentapproved recuperation time at home.
- 2. Medical quarantine imposed by the Health Department.
- 3. Religious observance (parents must request excused absences status for this in advance).
- 4. Death in the immediate family.
- 5. Medical or dental appointment (excused only when a doctor's or dentist's note is presented).
- 6. Special circumstances requested by the parents and approved by the school Director.

When a student returns to school after an absence, he/she must bring a written note from home, signed and dated by the parent, stating the reason(s) for the student's absence and indicating the date(s) of the absence.


Important Notice: Family Trips and Vacations are considered unexcused absences.




### **Volunteers Opportunity**

If you have signed in previously and need to add hours, please go to <u>fallslakeacademy.galaxydigital.com</u> and sign in using the student email address and password. You can also check what hours you've already submitted by signing in.

#### If you have never signed in, here's what you need to know:

- 1) The last four digits of your student's ID number you can find that in Jupiter under Settings.
- 2) All students already have an account with GetConnected. I created those. You do not have to 'sign up' with your student's information.
- 3) All student hours must be logged under their student email address. Parents create their own GetConnected account to log Family Involvement Hours.

#### Here's how you log student hours:

#### 1) Go to Get Connected:

\* You can either go to <u>fallslakeacademy.galaxydigital.com</u> or go to www.fallslakeacademy.com, click on Students, and click on Student Volunteer Hours

#### 2) Enter Username:

Student's username is first name + last name @ fallslakeacademy.com
For example, mine is elizabethdoerfler@fallslakeacademy.com
There is no punctuation between the first name and the last name.

#### 3) Enter password:

The password follows our typical password protocol.

Password is: FLA (uppercase) + first letter of last name (lowercase) + last four digits of student ID number.

For example, if my student ID is 186861324, my password might be: FLAd1324 You are welcome to change that once you log in or you can leave it as that. This is a password that most of our students (those who were here before Covid) know.

#### 4) Click Add Hours


- When it asks, is this in response to an opportunity, click No.
- Under Location I'd put a very short description, not just a place:
- Packing bags at ACIM or Delivering groceries to elderly neighbor
- You will also be asked for someone who can verify these hours. It may be the event coordinator
  or it may be the parent.
- · Put in date and number of hours.
- Under Description Put a more detailed description if you wish.
- Make sure you choose "Student Volunteer Hours"
- The family involvement code is not needed for Student Volunteer Hours.
- 5) When you are done, you can click "Log Out" in the drop-down menu in the top-right corner. If you have multiple students in the school, repeat the process for each student.
