Learning During the Pandemic

Fenton closed for in-person learning in March of 2020, with limited remote instruction for the remainder of the semester. For the 2020-2021 school year, Fenton implemented a remote learning model. Instruction was fully remote through mid-March of 2021, when Fenton switched to a hybrid schedule. At that point about 20% of students opted into in-person hybrid learning. The majority of our students learned fully remotely the 2020-2021 school year. Our remote and hybrid schedules were structured so that students learned both synchronously and asynchronously. For the 2021-2022 school year we resumed our regular in-person instructional model and continue in this manner.
