We were delighted to have three whole year groups taking part. 

## **EAL PERSONALITY COMPETITION**









# **ICT**



## **RUGBY 7S**

#### Millfield Rugby Sevens

We can now say that the Millfield Rugby Sevens is truly an international tournament, with Dubai College coming along to be part of the U13 tournament. A great day, with teams coming from all over the UK to be part of the tournaments. It was the first year that the U12s played for the Winners Rose Shield with the 3rd Place Shield being up for grabs. The U12s again played good rugby and there is excitement about what the boys can do in the years to come. They went through to the Winners Rose Shield matches, but unfortunately came up just short, losing out to a strong Caldicott team. The U13s played superbly, winning their group matches and getting through to the Winners Group. Here, they continued their good form and played with vigour to end up winning the Frazer Mackenzie Andrew Winners Bowl.

#### **Rosslyn Park Sevens**

The U13s played in their last rugby sevens tournament of the year down in London at the National Schools competition. With the chance to play teams from all over the country, including two Scottish teams, who had dominated for the first two terms. The boys were up for the challenge, continuing to play with ferocious defence, and went on to win all five matches and come out unbeaten at Rosslyn Park.

This means the U13 boys have not lost a match of rugby sevens this term. But the measure of success from the coaches involved has not been the wins, but the massive progress in the way the boys have played. 






# YEAR 2 TOYS
