Dear RMS-CES families,

What a fantastic start to quarter three! Below are a few updates...

Please know that next week we will be completing FAST testing in the buildings for both reading and math. We would like to encourage students to bring their personal headphones/earbuds to use with the tests as most students have expressed this to be the preferences as opposed to using the district provided headphones. The reading FAST test begins Tuesday, January 31st and the Math FAST test begins on Thursday, February 2nd. Please know that headphones would be allowed only during testing and not be allowed during the class hours unless directly approved by the teacher. This is a district test to assess growth in our students and the results will help our teachers determine if some of our students would benefit from additional instructional support.

All the chatter is around our Dance on February 10th from 6-8pm. Please save the date for those who are interested. We will have pre-sales happening in the building throughout the week. 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
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CLASSROOM CORNER


6TH GRADE MATH-MR. PETROSKI

As the 3rd quarter begins, students are working with percentages. Earlier this year, 6th graders were finding equivalences between fractions, decimals, and percentages. They are now using those skills to find the percent

off of items, percentages with taxes, and finding the percentage of numbers. As this quarter progresses, the next major unit of study is an introduction to Algebra. 6th graders will solve multi-step algebraic problems. They will learn using the *Order of*




Operations get flipped in Algebra. Instead of trying to solve equations, they will be actually trying to "undo"



the equations to find the value of different variables.

7TH GRADE MATH-MS. SHARP

This week in math, 7th graders practiced writing equations from the given information in word problems. They discussed what information was not given, what the total of each equation should be, and then worked backwards to complete the equation using math vocabulary and keywords. After practicing how to write two-step equations, 7th graders solved two-step equations with an emphasis on showing work. Overall, it was a successful week and they worked very hard! Next Thursday and Friday, 7th graders will take their Math FAST Tests in class and I can't wait to see how they do!







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7TH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS-MS. UDALLA

Seventh graders have been using sensory imagery (descriptive words and figurative language that evoke the 5 senses) to



improve their writing skills. This week they used their 5 senses to inspect 6 different snacks. They looked, listened, tasted, touched, and smelled them! Then they used adjectives to "show" not "tell" us about each food!
