Middle School Speech Team Update-Mr. John Bowen


The Rocket Speech team's season is well underway! Our team has competed at several area invitationals with several students placing at those meets.

RMS-CES VOLUNTEER CLUB-Ms. Kaufman



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

This week, 7th graders reviewed how to write and solve one- and two-step inequalities. They used key vocabulary words to determine which inequality sign to use and whether there needed to be addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division to accurately represent each situation. They practiced flipping the inequality sign when they solved by multiplying or dividing by negative numbers, and they practiced how to graph their solutions on number lines. Students took their test to conclude their Inequalities unit and started their next unit on Geometry. Students determined how to solve for the circumference and area of circles this week, and will practice this more next week.
