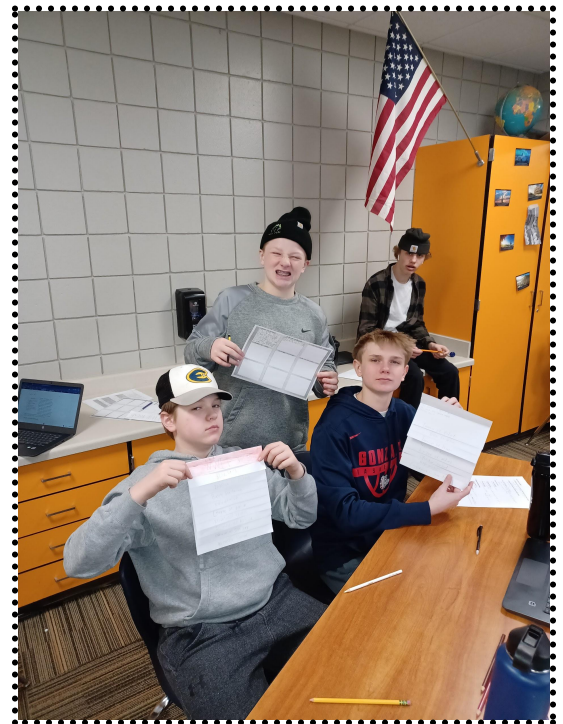
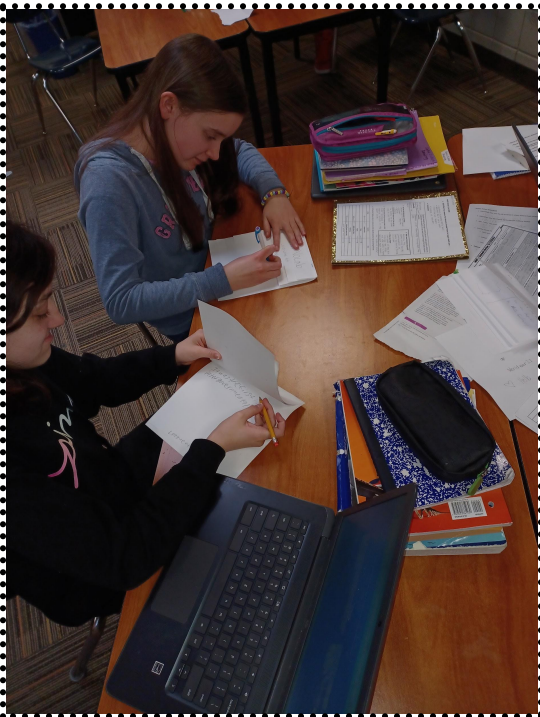
5TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES-MS. MILLER

5th graders started their Mapping unit this week! On Wednesday, our learning target was "I can explore the World", as students got to follow along a virtual field trip through Google Earth. Students "visited" major landmarks like Buckingham Palace, the Sydney Opera House, the Great Wall of China, the White House, along with many others around the world. They'll begin a map project next week where they can create their own Nation, designing it and adding symbols based on what they've learned about TODALS.

8TH GRADE SOCIAL STUDIES-MR. RILEY

This week in 8th Grade Social Studies, students learned about the **Second World War**, focusing mainly on its causes, and its impact on Europe and the world. They investigated the United States responses both before and after the attack on Pearl Harbor, and the war in Europe and the Pacific. Here are pictures of students who created a flipbook of knowledge to help describe and understand the importance of vocabulary related to World War 2.

In past weeks, 8th grade Social Studies students "Became the Expert" on individual countries throughout Africa, focusing on physical geography, human made features, histories and government methods, in order to present and educate their classmates about the country they studied.
